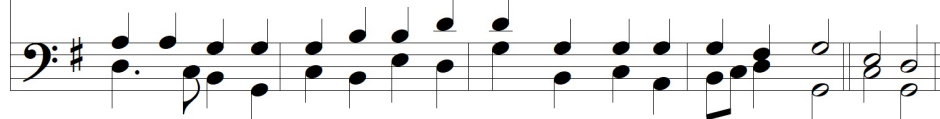
1. Al - le - lu - ia, song of glad-ness, voice of joy that can-not die;
