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foreword

The offices and blessings contained in this Ritual were adapted from the western forms in use for centuries before 1958. Some were revised by a committee consisting of Fathers Chambault, Turner, Schmemann, Schneirla and Upson and were authorized in 1952 for official use in the Western Rite Vicariate by the late Metropolitan Anthony Bashir of thriceblessed memory. In his original preface he noted that the forms for Christian Initiation were approved in 1911 by Metropolitan Gerassimos (Messarah) of Beirut with whom the young Deacon Anthony Bashir first came to the United States.

Revisions have been confined to such matters as flawed pneumatology, the removal of references to persons venerated for careers outside of the Church, and doctrines or opinions alien to Orthodoxy.

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
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CHE ORDER FOR CHE BAPCISM OF AN INFANC

The clean Baptismal Font is filled with clear water. The container for salt and the phials of Holy Chrism and Oil of Catechumens are placed nearby. The Priest, with acolytes and other clergy, the Cross and candles going before, and with thurible and incense, comes to the Font, and there, or before the Altar of the Baptistery, says the Litanies. Note that when previously blessed water is available the service may begin with the questioning at the Doors of the Church, p. 7.




The Priest shall say and repeat a second time the following verse:

That thou would st vouch safe to \oplus bless and \oplus consecrate this Font for the regeneration unto the of / new offspring, we beseech...

Then he shall continue the Litanies.

That it may please thee graciously / to hear us, **we beseech.**.. - / Son of God, **we beseech...**





The Our Father and the Apostles Creed may be said. Then follows:

- *V*. With thee, O Lord, is the well / of life.
- *R*. And in thy light shall we / see light.
- V. O Lord, hear / my prayer.
- *R*. And let my cry come un/to thee.
- *V*. The Lord be with / you.
- *R*. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, be present at the mysteries, be present at the sacraments of thy great goodness: and send forth the spirit of adoption for the regeneration of the new peoples whom the Font of Baptism doth bring forth unto thee: that what is to be done by our humble ministry, may be effectually fulfilled by thy power. Through... **Amen.**

The Priest may bless the Oil of Catechumens here, if it is not available, using the form on p. 204.

EXORCISM OF THE WATER

I exorcise thee, O creature of water, by the living \clubsuit God, by the true \clubsuit God, by the ho \clubsuit ly God, by God, who in the beginning through his Word divided thee from the dry land: whose Spirit moved upon thee, who commanded thee to flow from paradise.

Here he divides the water with his hand, and then scatters it, outside the rim of the Font, towards the four quarters of the world, saying:

And commanded thee to water the whole earth with thy four rivers, Who in the desert by wood bestowed upon thee sweetness when thou wast bitter, that men might drink. Who brought thee forth from the rock, that he might refresh the people, wearied with thirst, whom he had delivered out of Egypt. I exorcise thee through Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord: who in Cana of Galilee by a wondrous miracle did change thee through his power into wine: who walked upon thee with his feet, and was baptized in thee by John in Jordan. Who brought thee forth together with blood from his side: and commanded his disciples, that they should baptize in thee them that believe, saying: Go ye, teach all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, that thou mayest be made holy water, blessed water, water that washeth away stains and cleanseth sins. I command thee therefore, every unclean spirit, every phantom, every lie, be rooted out, and flee away from this creature of water; that to them who shall be baptized therein, it may become a Font of water springing up unto life eternal, regenerating them unto God the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Ghost, in the Name of the same our Lord Jesus Christ, who shall come to judge the living and the dead, and the world by fire. Amen.

Let us pray: O Lord Holy, Father almighty, everlasting God, who dost sanctify spiritual waters, we humbly entreat thee: that thou wouldest vouchsafe to look upon this ministry of our humble service, and to send forth upon these waters, made ready for the washing and purifying of men, the Angel of holiness; to the end that, the sins of their former life being washed, and their guilt cleansed, they being regenerate may be worthy to be made a spotless habitation for the Holy Spirit. Through... in the unity of the same Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Then, he breathes thrice into the water, in three directions according to this figure ψ . Then he puts incense in the thurible, and having blessed it, censes the Font, with three simple swings. Next,

pouring some of the Oil of Catechumens into the water in the form of a Cross, he says in a loud voice:

May this Font be sanctified and made fruitful by the Oil of salvation, for such as shall be born again therefrom unto life eternal, in the Name of the \clubsuit Father, and of the \clubsuit Son, and of the \clubsuit Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

Then in the same manner, he pours in some of the Chrism, saying:

May this inpouring of the Chrism of our Lord Jesus Christ, and of the Holy Spirit the Paraclete, be wrought in the Name of the holy Trinity. **Amen.**

Next he takes both phials of the said holy Oil and the Chrism, and pours in some of both together in the form of a Cross, saying:

May this commingling of the Chrism of sanctification, and of the Oil of Unction, and of the water of Baptism be likewise wrought in the Name of the \clubsuit Father, and of the \clubsuit Son, and of the \clubsuit Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

Then setting down the phials, with his right hand he mingles the holy Oil and the infused Chrism with the Water, and scatters it over the whole Font. Then he wipes his hand with crumbs of bread. He then changes his vestments from purple to white.

AT THE DOORS OF THE CHURCH.

The Priest, having ascertained the name(s), questions the Child (each separately if there are several to be baptized). The Godparents answer for the Child.

N., what do you ask of the Church of God? *R*. Faith.

Priest: What does Faith bring you to? R. Life Everlasting.

Priest: If then you desire to enter into life, keep the commandments. Thou shalt love the Lord thy God, with all thy heart, with all thy soul, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself.

Then he blows three times gently into the face of the Child, and says once:

Go out of *him (her)* thou unclean spirit, and give place unto the Holy Spirit the Paraclete.

Then he makes with his thumb the sign of the Cross on the forehead and on the breast of the Child, saying

Receive the sign of the Cross both upon thy \clubsuit forehead and also on the \clubsuit heart, take unto the the faith of the heavenly precepts: and be thou such in thy conversation, that thou may est now be the temple of God.

Let us pray: We beseech thee, O Lord, graciously hear our prayers, and keep with thy perpetual power this thine Elect, *N*., who hath been signed with the sign of the Cross of the Lord: that *he (she)*, preserving the rudiments of the greatness of thy glory, may by keeping of thy commandments be worthy to attain unto the glory of regeneration. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Then he places his hand upon the head of the Child and afterwards extending his hand, he says

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, vouchsafe to look upon this thy *servant* (*handmaid*) *N.*, whom thou hast been pleased to call to the rudiments of the faith: drive far from *him* (*her*) all blindness of heart: break all the snares of Satan, wherewith *he* hath been bound: open to *him* (*her*), O Lord, the gate of thy mercy, that, being filled with the sign of thy wisdom, *he* (*she*) may be free from all evil desires, and in the sweet savor of thy command-ments may joyfully serve thee in thy Church, and prosper from day to day. Through the same Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

BLESSING OF THE SALT

Note that this blessing may be omitted if salt has been blessed previously.

I exorcise thee, O creature of salt, in the Name of God the \clubsuit Father almighty, and in the charity of our Lord \clubsuit Jesus Christ, and in the power of the \clubsuit Holy Ghost. I exorcise thee through God \clubsuit the living, through God \clubsuit the true, through God \clubsuit the holy, through God \clubsuit , who created thee for the protection of mankind, and commanded thee to be consecrated through his servants for the people that should come to believe; that in the Name of the holy Trinity thou be made a saving sacrament to put to flight the enemy. Therefore we pray thee, O Lord our God, that sanctifying thou wouldest \clubsuit sanctify, and blessing thou wouldest \clubsuit bless this creature of salt, that it be made to all who receive it perfect healing, abiding in their members, in the Name of the same our Lord Jesus Christ, who shall come to judge the living and the dead, and the world by fire. **Amen**.

Then he puts a little of the blessed salt into the mouth of the Child, saying

N., Receive the salt of wisdom: may it avail thee for mercy unto life eternal. **Amen.**

Priest. Peace be with thee. *R.* And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: O God of our fathers, O God the author of all truth, we humbly entreat thee, that thou wouldest vouchsafe mercifully to look upon this thy *servant (handmaid)* N., and that thou wouldest suffer *him (her)* no longer to hunger, now tasting this first relish of salt, to the end that, being fulfilled with heavenly food, *he (she)* may ever be fervent in spirit, rejoicing in hope, ever serving thy Name. Lead *him (her)*, O Lord, we beseech thee, to the washing of the new birth, that *he (she)* may with thy faithful be worthy to attain unto the eternal rewards of thy promises. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE EXORCISMS

I exorcise thee, unclean spirit, in the Name of the \oplus Father, and of the \oplus Son, and of the \oplus Holy Ghost, that thou go out, and depart from this *servant (handmaid)* of God *N*. For He Himself commands thee, accursed and damned one, who walked with His feet upon the sea, and stretched forth His hand to Peter as he sank. Therefore, accursed devil, acknowledge thy sentence, and give honor to Jesus Christ His Son, and to the Holy Ghost, and depart from this *servant (handmaid)* of God *N.*, forasmuch as our God and Lord Jesus Christ hath vouchsafed to call *him (her)* to His holy grace and benediction, and to the Font of Baptism.

He signs the Child upon the forehead saying:

And this sign of the Holy \bigstar Cross, which we set upon *his (her)* brow, do thou, accursed devil, never dare to violate. Through the same Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Priest then lays his hand upon the head of the Child, and afterwards holding it extended, says:

Let us pray: I entreat thy eternal and most just mercy, O Lord holy, Father almighty, everlasting God, author of light and truth, upon this *servant (handmaid)* of God N., that thou wouldest vouchsafe to enlighten *him (her)* with the light of thine understanding: cleanse *him (her)* and sanctify *him (her)*: give *him* true knowledge, that being made worthy of the grace of thy Baptism, *he (she)* may hold firm hope, right counsel and holy doctrine. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Then the Priest places the end of his stole which hangs from his left shoulder on the Child and leads him into the Church saying

N., enter into the temple of God, that thou mayest have part with Christ unto life eternal. **Amen**.

IN THE CHURCH

When they are come into the Church, the Priest going towards the Font, says with the people:

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible; And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, Very God of Very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made: who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate, he suffered and was buried; and the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father; and He shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end. And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, and Giver of Life, who proceedeth from the Father, who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spake by the Prophets; and I believe One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church. I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins. I look for the Resurrection of the dead, \blacksquare and the Life of the world to come. Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven: hallowed be thy Name: thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread: and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trepass against us. And lead us not into temptation: but deliver us from evil. Amen.

And then, with his back turned to the Baptistery, he says

I exorcise thee, every unclean spirit, in the Name of God the PFather Almighty, and in the Name of P Jesus Christ His Son, our Lord and Judge, and in the power of the P Holy Ghost, that thou depart from this creature of God, *N*., which our Lord hath vouchsafed to call unto His holy temple, that it may become the temple of the living God, and that the Holy Spirit may dwell therein. Through the same Christ our Lord, who shall come to judge the living and the dead, and the world by fire. **Amen**.

Then the Priest, with his thumb, touches the ears of the Child, saying

EPHTHATHA, that is, Be opened.

Then he touches the nostrils saying

For a savor of sweetness. But thou, devil, flee away; for the judgement of God draweth nigh.

Then he questions the child to be baptized by name, the Godparents answering.

N., do you renounce Satan? R. I do renounce him.And all his works? R. I do renounce them.And all his allurements? R. I do renounce them.

Then the Priest dips his thumb in the Oil of Catechumens, and anoints the Child on the breast, and between the shoulders in the form of a Cross, saying once

I anoint \blacksquare thee with the Oil of salvation in Christ Jesus our Lord, that thou mayest have eternal life. **Amen.**

Then he wipes his thumb and the places anointed with cotton or something similar. The Priest at the Font then questions the Child to be baptized, the Godparents answering.

N., do you believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth? *R.* I do believe.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ his only Son, our Lord, who was born into this world, and who suffered for us? *R*. I do believe.

Do you also believe in the Holy Ghost, the Holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting? *R*. I do believe.

Then, naming the Child to be baptized, the Priest says

N., Will you be baptized? R. I will.

The Priest then baptizes the Child with a three-fold immersion (or pouring, according to circumstance) at the same time clearly and distinctly pronouncing the form once only, saying:

N., I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

THE ORDER OF CHRISMATION

Having washed his hands, the Priest stands with his face toward the newly baptized, and says:

May the Holy Ghost come upon you, and may the power of the Most High preserve you from sin. **Amen.**

Then, signing himself with the sign of the Cross he says:

 $V_{\cdot} \neq$ Our help is in the Name of / the Lord.

R. Who hath made heaven / and earth.

V. O Lord hear / our prayer.

- *R*. And let our cry come un/to thee.
- *V*. The Lord be with / you.
- *R*. And with thy spi/rit.

With his hands extended over the newly baptized, he says:

Let us pray: Almighty everlasting God, who hast vouchsafed to regenerate this Thy *servant (handmaid)* by water and the Holy Ghost, and hast given unto *him (her)* the remission of all *his (her)* sins, send forth upon *him (her)* Thy seven-fold Spirit, the Holy Paraclete from heaven. **Amen.**

The Spirit of Wisdom and understanding. **Amen.** The Spirit of counsel and fortitude. **Amen.** The Spirit of knowledge and godliness. **Amen.**

Replenish *him (her)* with the Spirit of Thy fear, and sign *him (her)* with the sign of the \oplus Cross of Christ, in Thy mercy unto life eternal. Through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the same Holy Spirit, God, world without end. **Amen.**

The Priest, having dipped the end of his right thumb in Chrism, makes the sign of the Cross with his thumb, on the newly baptized, saying


N., I sign thee with the sign of the \clubsuit Cross, and I confirm thee with the Chrism of Salvation: the Seal of the gift of the Holy Spirit. In the Name of the \oiint Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

Then the Priest strikes the Child gently on the cheek saying Peace be with thee.

The Priest wipes the forehead of the Child with cotton and his own hands with bread crumb, and washes them over a basin. While he is washing his hands, the following is sung or said:



Con-firm, O Lord, what Thou hast wrought in us, from Thy



Con-firm, O Lord...

The Priest then says:

- *V.* Show us thy mercy, / O Lord.
- *R*. And grant us thy salva/tion.
- V. O Lord, hear / my prayer.
- *R*. And let my cry come un/to thee.
- *V*. The Lord be with / you.
- *R*. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: O God, Who didst give to Thine Apostles the Holy Spirit, and didst will that by them and their successors He should be delivered to the rest of the faithful; look mercifully on the service of our humility; and grant that the heart of *him (her)* whose forehead we have anointed with the sacred Chrism, and signed with the sign of the holy Cross, may, by the same Holy Spirit descending therein, be made the temple of his glory. Who, with the Father and the same Holy Spirit, liveth and reigneth, God, world without end. **Amen.**

Behold, thus shall every man be blessed that feareth the Lord.

The Priest places on the head of the Child either a small white Chrisom or some white substitute and says:

Receive this white garment, and see thou carry it without stain before the judgement-seat of our Lord Jesus Christ, that thou mayest have eternal life. **Amen.**

He then gives to him a lighted taper, saying:

Receive this burning light, and keep thy baptism, so as to be without blame; keep the commandments of God, that, when the Lord shall come to the nuptials, thou mayest meet Him in the company of all the Saints in the heavenly court, and have eternal life, and live for ever and ever. **Amen.**

HOLY COMMUNION

As Holy Communion is prepared from the Reserved Sacrament a hymn may be sung. The Priest holding the Blessed Sacrament, says:

Behold the Lamb of God; behold him that taketh away the sins of the world.

Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest enter under my roof: but only say the word and my soul shall be healed *(Thrice)*.

The Priest administers Holy Communion to the Child, saying:

The Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ preserve thy body and soul unto everlasting life. *And the Godparents reply:* **Amen.**

Then the Priest says:

Let us pray. Pour forth on us, O Lord, the spirit of Thy love; that those whom Thou hast filled with the paschal Sacrament, may, by Thy goodness, live in perfect concord. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth... Amen.

N., Go in peace, and the Lord be with you. Amen.


Making the sign of the Cross over the Child, he says:


May the Lord \oplus bless you out of Sion, that you may see the good things of Jerusalem all the days of your life, and have life everlasting. **Amen.**

Che Order for Holy Baptism For Hdults

BEFORE THE ALTAR

The clean Baptismal Font is filled with clear water. The container for salt and the phials of Holy Chrism and Oil of Catechumens are placed nearby. The Baptismal Candle and Chrisom (white cloth) are prepared. The Priest (vested in surplice and purple stole and cope), with acolytes and assisting clerics, kneels at the steps of the Altar and silently offers devout prayers to God that he may worthily administer this great Sacrament. Rising, he makes the sign of the Cross and says or sings:






PSALM 29 Afferte Domino



- ASCRIBE unto the Lord, O ye / mighty, * ascribe unto the Lord / worship and strength.
- 2. Ascribe unto the Lord the honor due un/to his Name; * worship the Lord with / holy worship.
- *3*. The voice of the Lord is upon the / waters; * it is the glorious God that ma/keth the thunder.
- 4. It is the Lord that ruleth the sea; the voice of the Lord is mighty in oper/ation; * the voice of the Lord / is a glorious voice.
- 5. The voice of the Lord breaketh the / cedar-trees; * yea, the Lord breaketh the ce/dars of Lebanon.
- 6. He maketh them also to skip / like a calf; * Lebanon also, and Sirion, like / a young unicorn.
- 7. The voice of the Lord divideth the flames of fire; the voice of the Lord shaketh the / wilderness; * yea, the Lord shaketh the wilder/ness of Kadesh.
- 8. The voice of the Lord maketh the hinds to bring forth young, and strippeth bare the / forests: * in his temple doth every thing speak / of his honor.
- 9. The Lord sitteth above the / water-flood, * and the Lord remaineth a / King for ever.
- *10.* The Lord shall give strength unto his / people; * the Lord shall give his people the / blessing of peace.

Glory be to the Father and / to the Son, * and / to the Holy Ghost.

As it was in the beginning, † is now and ever / shall be, * world / without end. Amen.



Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, who hast given unto us thy servants grace by the confession of a true faith to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity, and in the power of the Majesty to worship the Unity: we beseech thee; that through the steadfastness of this faith we may evermore be defended from all adversities.

Almighty God, we beseech thee to hear our prayers: may the working of thy power accomplish what is to be done through our lowly ministry.

Grant, O Lord, we beseech thee, to thy *servant (handmaid)*, that, being instructed in thy holy mysteries, *he (she)* may be born again in the water of baptism and counted among the members of thy holy Church. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

AT THE DOORS OF THE CHURCH

The Priest, having ascertained the name(s), questions the Catechumen (each separately if there are several to be baptized). If a Catechumen is a child, the godparents answer.

Priest: N., what do you ask of the Church of God? *R.* Faith.

Priest: What does Faith bring you to? *R*. Life Everlasting.

Priest: If then you desire to enter into life, keep the commandments. Thou shalt love the Lord thy God, with all thy heart, with all thy soul, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets. Now the faith teaches this: that you shall adore one God in three Persons, and three Persons in one God. The three Persons in God are distinct, never to be confused one with the other, while the nature of God is one and only one. The Father is one Person; the Son is a second; the Holy Spirit is a third. Yet these three have only one nature and are one God.

The Priest asks

N, do you renounce Satan? R. I do renounce him.

P. And all his works? *R*. I do renounce them.

P. And all his allurements? R. I do renounce them.

P. Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Maker of heaven and earth? *R*. I do believe.

P. Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born into this world and who suffered? *R*. I do believe.

P. Do you believe also in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting? *R.* I do believe.

Then he blows three times gently into the face of the Catechumen, and says once

Go out of *him (her)* thou unclean spirit, and give place unto the Holy Spirit the Paraclete.

He breathes in the form of a Cross upon the catechumen's face and says

N., through this rite of breathing upon you, receive the good spirit and the \oplus blessing of God. Peace be with you.

The Catechumen replies:

R. And with thy spirit.

Then he makes with his thumb the sign of the Cross on the forehead and on the breast the Catechumen, saying

Receive the sign of the Cross both upon thy \clubsuit forehead and also on the \clubsuit heart, take unto thee the faith of the heavenly precepts: and be thou such in thy conversation, that thou mayest now be the temple of God. Having entered into the Church of God, be happy in knowing that you have escaped the snares of death. Worship only God, the Father almighty, and Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, and the all-holy, good, and life giving Spirit.

Let us pray: O Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, I pray thee, show thy *servant (handmaid)*, *N*, the way of the true faith and the knowledge of thyself. For *he (she)* wanders in uncertainty and doubt through the darkness of this world. Then, when the eyes of *his (her)* heart have been opened, *he (she)* will profess thee to be the one God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. May *he (she)* enjoy the

fruit of this profession of faith both here and in the world to come. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

With his thumb the Priest makes the sign of the Cross upon each candidate's forehead, saying

I sign you on the ₱ forehead that you may take up the Lord's Cross.

Upon his ears I sign you on the # ears that you may listen attentively to God's commands.

Upon his eyes I sign you on the \oplus eyes that you may see God's glory.

Upon his nostrils I sign you on the \oplus nostrils that you may perceive the sweet fragrance of Christ.

Upon his mouth I sign you on the Φ mouth that you may speak words of life.

Upon his breast I sign you on the \oplus breast that you may believe in God.

Upon his shoulders I sign you on the \square shoulders that you may take upon yourself the yoke of his service.

The Priest makes the sign of the Cross upon the whole body of the candidate, without touching him, saying

I sign your whole being, in the Name of the \oplus Father and of the \oplus Son and of the \oplus Holy Spirit, that you may have eternal life and live forever. **Amen.** Let us pray: We beseech thee, O Lord, graciously hear our prayers, and keep with thy perpetual power this thine Elect, *N*, who hath been signed with the sign of the Cross of the Lord: that *he* (*she*), preserving the rudiments of the greatness of thy glory, may by keeping of thy commandments be worthy to attain unto the glory of regeneration. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Let us pray: O God, Creator of the human race and also its Redeemer, be merciful to the people thou hast adopted. Enroll these reborn children in the New Covenant. Then, as children of promise, they will joyfully receive by grace what they could not attain by nature. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then he places his hand upon the head of the Catechumen and afterwards extending his hand, he says

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ, vouchsafe to look upon this thy *servant* (*handmaid*) N. whom thou hast been pleased to call to the rudiments of the faith: drive far from *him* (*her*) all blindness of heart: break all the snares of Satan, wherewith *he* (*she*) hath been bound: open to *him* (*her*), O Lord, the gate of thy mercy, that, being filled with the sign of thy wisdom, *he* (*she*) may be free from all evil desires, and in the sweet savor of thy commandments may joyfully serve thee in thy Church, and prosper from day to day. Through the same Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

BLESSING OF THE SALT

I exorcise thee, O creature of salt, in the Name of God the \oplus Father almighty, and in the charity of our Lord \oplus Jesus Christ, and in the power of the \oplus Holy Ghost. I exorcise thee through God \oplus the living, through God \oplus the true, through God \oplus the holy, through God \oplus , who created thee for the protection of mankind, and commanded thee to be consecrated through his servants for the people that should come to believe; that in the Name of the holy Trinity thou be made a saving sacrament to put to flight the enemy. Therefore we pray thee, O Lord our God, that sanctifying thou wouldest \clubsuit sanctify, and blessing thou wouldest \clubsuit bless this creature of salt, that it be made to all who receive it perfect healing, abiding in their members, in the Name of the same our Lord Jesus Christ, who shall come to judge the living and the dead, and the world by fire. **Amen**.

Let us pray: O Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, yesterday, today, and forever, without beginning and without end, we humbly implore thee on behalf of thy *servant (handmaid) N*, whom thou hast freed from the errors of unbelief and evil living. Graciously hear *him (her)* who bows *his (her)* head to thee at this purifying Font. Born again of water and the Holy Spirit and having put off the old man, may *he (she)* put on the new man who is created in thy image. May *he (she)* put on a pure and spotless robe, and be worthy to serve thee, our God. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Then he puts a little of the blessed salt into the mouth of the Catechumen, saying

N., Receive the salt of wisdom: may it avail thee for mercy unto life eternal. **Amen.**

Priest. Peace be with thee. R. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: O God of our fathers, O God the author of all truth, we humbly entreat thee, that thou wouldest vouchsafe mercifully to look upon this thy *servant (handmaid)* N., and that thou wouldest suffer *him* no longer to hunger, now tasting this first relish of salt, to the end that, being fulfilled with heavenly food, *he (she)* may ever be fervent in spirit, rejoicing in hope, ever serving thy Name. Lead *him (her)*, O Lord, we beseech thee, to the washing of the new birth, that *he (she)* may with thy faithful be worthy to attain unto the eternal rewards of thy promises. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE EXORCISMS

Three exorcisms follow, before each of which is said Kneel down, chosen one of God, and say the Our Father.

The candidate kneels and prays after which the Priest says

Stand up; end your prayer by saying: Amen.

The candidate rises and replies: Amen.

The Priest says to the sponsors Make the sign of the Cross on *him*.

Then he says to the candidate Come forward.

The godparents make the sign of the Cross on the candidate's foreheard, saying

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The priest also makes the sign of the Cross on the candidate's forehead and says:

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Next, the priest lays his hand on the candidate's head and then, with his hand extended, says:

Let us pray. O God of Abraham, God of Isaac, God of Jacob, thou appearedst on Mount Sinai to thy servant, Moses; thou leddest the children of Israel out of Egypt, graciously appointing an Angel to guard them day and night. We ask thee, Lord, to send thy holy Angel from heaven to guard in the same way thy *servant (handmaid)*, *N*, and to lead *him (her)* to the grace of thy baptism. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Therefore, accursed devil, acknowledge your condemnation, and pay homage to the living and true God; pay homage to Jesus Christ, his Son, and to the Holy Spirit, and depart from this *servant (handmaid)* of God, N, for Jesus Christ, our God and Lord, has called *him (her)* to his holy grace and to the Font of baptism. Accursed devil, never dare to desecrate this sign of the holy \oplus Cross *(he signs him)* which we are tracing upon *his (her)* forehead. Through the same Christ our Lord, who is to come to judge the living and the dead and the world by fire. **Amen.**

Again the priest says to the candidate: Kneel down, chosen one of God, and say the Our Father.

The candidate kneels, prays, and says the Our Father as far as But deliver us from evil *inclusively. The priest adds:* Stand up; end your prayer by saying: Amen.

The candidate rises and replies: Amen.

The priest says to the sponsors: Make the sign of the Cross on him.

Then he says to the candidate: Come forward.

And the sponsor makes the sign of the Cross upon the candidate's forehead, saying:

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The priest also makes the sign of the Cross on the candidate's forehead and says:

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Next the priest lays his hand upon the catechumen's head and then, with his hand extended, says:

Let us pray. O God, thou art the unfailing support of those who call upon thee, the liberator of those who pray to thee, the peace of those who appeal to thee, the life of those who believe in thee, the resurrection of those who die in thee. I call upon thee in behalf of thy *servant (handmaid)*, *N*, who asks for the gift of baptism, and who hopes to obtain, through this spiritual rebirth, everlasting grace. Accept *him (her)*, *O* Lord. Thou hast graciously said, "Ask, and ye shall receive; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you." Then grant thy favor to him who knocks, so that, having received an everlasting blessing in *his (her)* baptism, he may possess the kingdom of grace that thou hast promised. Who, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, livest and reignest ever one God, world without end. **Amen.**

Hear, accursed Satan. I adjure you by the Name of the eternal God and of our Savior Jesus Christ, depart with your envy, conquered, trembling, and groaning. May you have no part in the *servant (handmaid)* of God, *N*, who already has thoughts of heaven and who is about to renounce you and your world and achieve a blessed immortality. Therefore give honor to the Holy Spirit who, descending from the high throne of heaven, comes to upset your wiles and to make perfect the heart cleansed at the divine fountain, a temple and dwelling place dedicated to God. And thus entirely freed from the harmful effects of past sins, may this *servant (handmaid)* of God give thanks always to the eternal God and bless his Holy Name for ever and ever. **Amen.**

A third time the priest says to the candidate: Kneel down, chosen one of God, and say the Our Father.

The candidate kneels, prays, and says the Our Father as far as But deliver us from evil *inclusively. The priest adds:* Stand up; end your prayer by saying: Amen.

The candidate rises and replies: Amen.

The priest says to the sponsor: Make the sign of the Cross on him.

Then he says to the candidate: Come forward.

And the sponsor makes the sign of the Cross on the candidate's forehead, saying:

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

The priest also makes the sign of the Cross on the candidate's forehead and says:

In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Next the priest lays his hand upon him and then, with his hand extended, says:

I exorcise you, unclean spirit, in the Name of the \oplus Father and of the \oplus Son and of the \oplus Holy Spirit. Come forth, depart from this *servant* (*handmaid*) of God, *N*, for he commands you, accursed and damned spirit, he who walked upon the sea and extended his right hand to Peter as he was sinking.

Therefore, accursed devil, acknowledge your condemnation and pay homage to the living and true God; pay homage to Jesus Christ, his Son, and to the Holy Spirit, and depart from this *servant (handmaid)* of God, N, for Jesus Christ, our Lord and God, has called *him (her)* to his holy grace and to the Font of baptism. Accursed devil, never dare to desecrate this sign of the holy \oplus Cross *(he signs him)* which we are tracing upon *his (her)* forehead. Through the same Christ our Lord, who is to come to judge the living and the dead and the world by fire. **Amen.**

After the exorcisms, the Priest lays his hand upon the head of the Catechumen, and afterwards holding it extended, says:

Let us pray: I entreat thy eternal and most just mercy, O Lord holy, Father almighty, everlasting God, author of light and truth, upon this *servant (handmaid)* of God N., that thou wouldest vouchsafe to enlighten *him (her)* with the light of thine understanding: cleanse *him (her)* and sanctify *him (her)*: give *him (her)* true knowledge, that being made worthy of the grace of thy Baptism, *he (she)* may hold firm hope, right counsel and holy doctrine. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen**. Then the Priest places the end of his stole which hangs from his left shoulder on the Catechumen and leads him into the Church saying

N., enter into the temple of God, that thou mayest have part with Christ unto life eternal. **Amen**.

IN THE CHURCH

When they are come into the Church, the Priest going towards the Font, says together with the Cathecumen and Sponsors:

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible; And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the Only-begotten, Begotten of the Father before all worlds, Light of Light, Very God of Very God, Begotten, not made; of one essence with the Father, by whom all things were made: Who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man; And was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate, and suffered and was buried; And the Third day He rose again, according to the Scriptures And ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of the Father; And He shall come again with glory to judge the quick and the dead, Whose kingdom shall have no end. And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, and Giver of Life, Who proceedeth from the Father, Who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, Who spake by the Prophets; And I believe in One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church. I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins. I look for the Resurrection of the dead, ₱ And the Life of the world to come. Amen.

Our Father, who art in heaven: hallowed be thy Name: thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread: and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trepass against us. And lead us not into temptation: but deliver us from evil. Amen. And then, with his back turned to the Baptistery, he says

The threats of punishments and tortures are not hidden from you, Satan, the day of judgement, the day of pain, the day which is to come like a fiery furnace, in which unending destruction is prepared for you and all your angels. Therefore, accursed and damnable one, pay homage to the living and true God; pay homage to Jesus Christ, his Son, give homage to the Holy Spirit, the Consoler, in whose Name and power I command you, unclean spirit, whoever you may be, go forth and depart from this *servant (handmaid)* of God, *N.*, whom this day Jesus Christ, our God and Lord, has called to his holy grace and blessing, and to the Font of baptism. May *he (she)* become the temple of God through the water of rebirth unto remission of all *his (her)* sins. In the Name of the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who shall come to judge the living and the dead, and the world by fire. **Amen**.

Then the Priest, with his thumb, touches the ears of the Catechumen, saying

EPHTHATHA, that is, Be opened.

Then he touches the nostrils saying

For a savor of sweetness. But thou, devil, flee away; for the judgement of God draweth nigh.

Then he questions the person to be baptized by name, saying

N, do you renounce Satan? *R*. I do renounce him. And all his works? *R*. I do renounce them. And all his allurements? *R*. I do renounce them.


Then the Priest dips his thumb in the Oil of Catechumens, and anoints the Catechumen on the breast, and between the shoulders in the form of a Cross, saying once I anoint \blacksquare thee with the Oil of salvation in Christ Jesus our Lord, that thou mayest have eternal life. **Amen.**

Then he wipes his thumb and the places anointed with cotton or something similar and says


Go forth, unclean spirit, and pay homage to the living and true God. Depart, unclean spirit, and give place to Jesus Christ, his Son. Depart, unclean spirit, and give place to the Holy Spirit, the Consoler.

The Priest, with acolytes and other clergy, the Cross and candles going before, and with thurible and incense, comes to the Font, and there, or before the Altar of the Baptistery, says the Litanies. Members of the congregation may light hand candles.

EXORCISM OF THE WATER

I exorcise thee, O creature of water, by the living \clubsuit God, by the true \clubsuit God, by the holy \clubsuit God, by God, who in the beginning through his word divided thee from the dry land: whose Spirit moved upon thee, who commanded thee to flow from paradise.

Here he divides the water with his hand, and then scatters it, outside the rim of the Font, towards the four quarters of the world, saying:

And commanded thee to water the whole earth with thy four rivers, Who in the desert by wood bestowed upon thee sweetness when thou wast bitter, that men might drink. Who brought thee forth from the rock, that he might refresh the people, wearied with thirst, whom he had delivered out of Egypt. I exorcise thee through Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord: who in Cana of Galilee by a wondrous miracle did change thee through his power into wine: who walked upon thee with his feet, and was baptized in thee by John in Jordan. Who brought thee forth together with blood from his side: and commanded his disciples, that they should baptize in thee them that believe, saying: Go ye, teach all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, that thou mayest be made holy water, blessed water, water that washeth away stains and cleanseth sins. I command thee therefore, every unclean spirit, every phantom, every lie, be rooted out, and flee away from this creature of water; that to them who shall be baptized therein, it may become a Font of water springing up unto life eternal, regenerating them unto God the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Ghost, in the Name of the same our Lord Jesus Christ, who shall come to judge the living and the dead, and the world by fire. Amen.

Let us pray: O Lord Holy, Father almighty, everlasting God, who dost sanctify spiritual waters, we humbly entreat thee: that thou wouldest vouchsafe to look upon this ministry of our humble service, and to send forth upon these waters, made ready for the washing and purifying of men, the Angel of holiness; to the end that, the sins of their former life being washed, and their guilt cleansed, they being regenerate may be worthy to be made a spotless habitation for the Holy Spirit. Through... in the unity of the same Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Then, he breathes thrice into the water, in three directions according to this figure ψ . Then he puts incense in the thurible, and having blessed it, censes the Font, with three simple swings. Next, pouring some of the Oil of Catechumens into the water in the form of a Cross, he says in a loud voice

May this Font be sanctified and made fruitful by the Oil of salvation, for such as shall be born again therefrom unto life eternal, in the Name of the \clubsuit Father, and of the \clubsuit Son, and of the \clubsuit Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

Then in the same manner, he pours in some of the Chrism, saying:

May this inpouring of the Chrism of our Lord Jesus Christ, and of the Holy Spirit the Paraclete, be wrought in the Name of the holy Trinity. **Amen.**

Next he takes both phials of the said holy Oil and the Chrism, and pours in some of both together in the form of a Cross, saying:

May this commingling of the Chrism of sanctification, and of the Oil of Unction, and of the water of Baptism be likewise wrought in the Name of the \oplus Father, and of the \oplus Son, and of the \oplus Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

Then setting down the phials, with his right hand he mingles the holy Oil and the infused Chrism with the Water, and scatters it over the whole Font. Then he wipes his hand with crumbs of bread. He then changes his vestments from purple to white. The Priest at the Font then questions the person to be baptized.

N., do you believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth? *R.* I do believe.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ his only Son, our Lord, who was born into this world, and who suffered for us? *R*. I do believe.

Do you also believe in the Holy Ghost, the Holy Catholic Church, the Communion of Saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting? *R*. I do believe.

Then, naming the person to be baptized, the Priest says

N., Will you be baptized? R. I will.

The Priest then baptizes the person with a three-fold immersion at the same time clearly and distinctly pronouncing the form once only, saying:

N., I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

CHE ORDER OF CHRISMHCION

When receiving converts whose Baptisms are recognized the service begins at this point. Having washed his hands, the Priest stands with his face toward the newly baptized, and says:

May the Holy Ghost come upon you, and may the power of the Most High preserve you from sin **Amen.**

Then, signing himself with the sign of the Cross he says:

 $V_{\cdot} \neq$ Our help is in the Name of / the Lord.

R. Who hath made heaven / and earth.

V. O Lord hear / our prayer.

R. And let our cry come un/to thee.

V. The Lord be with / you.

R. And with thy spi/rit.

With his hands extended over the newly baptized, he says:

Let us pray: Almighty everlasting God, who hast vouchsafed to regenerate this Thy *servant (handmaid)* by water and the Holy Ghost, and hast given unto *him (her)* the remission of all *his (her)* sins, send forth upon *him (her)* Thy seven-fold Spirit, the Holy Paraclete from heaven. **Amen.**

The Spirit of Wisdom and understanding. Amen.

The Spirit of counsel and fortitude. Amen.

The Spirit of knowledge and godliness. Amen.

Replenish *him (her)* with the Spirit of Thy fear, and sign *him (her)* with the sign of the \oplus Cross of Christ, in Thy mercy unto life eternal. Through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the same Holy Spirit, God, world without end. **Amen.**

The Priest, having dipped the end of his right thumb in Chrism, makes the sign of the Cross with his thumb, on the newly baptized, saying

N., I sign thee with the sign of the \clubsuit Cross, and I confirm thee with the Chrism of Salvation: the Seal of the gift of the Holy Spirit. In the Name of the \clubsuit Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

Then the Priest strikes the person gently on the cheek saying Peace be with thee.

The Priest wipes the forehead of the person with cotton and his own hands with bread crumb, and washes them over a basin. While he is washing his hands, the following is sung or said (the chant is found on p. 14):

Confirm, O Lord, what Thou hast wrought in us, from Thy holy temple which is in Jerusalem.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. Confirm...

The Priest then says:

V. Show us thy mercy, / O Lord.

- *R*. And grant us thy salva/tion.
- V. O Lord, hear / my prayer.
- *R*. And let my cry come un/to thee.
- *V*. The Lord be with / you.
- *R*. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: O God, Who didst give to Thine Apostles the Holy Spirit, and didst will that by them and their successors He should be delivered to the rest of the faithful; look mercifully on the service of our humility; and grant that the heart of *him (her)* whose forehead we have annointed with the sacred Chrism, and signed with the sign of the holy Cross, may, by the same Holy Spirit descending therein, be made the temple of his glory. Who, with the Father and the same Holy Spirit, liveth and reigneth, God, world without end. **Amen.**

Behold, thus shall every man be blessed that feareth the Lord.

Following a Baptism, the Priest places on the head of the person either a small white Chrisom or some white substitute and says:

Receive this white garment, and see thou carry it without stain before the judgement-seat of our Lord Jesus Christ, that thou mayest have eternal life. **Amen.**

He then gives to him a lighted taper, saying:

Receive this burning light, and keep thy baptism, so as to be without blame; keep the commandments of God, that, when the Lord shall

come to the nuptials, thou mayest meet Him in the company of all the Saints in the heavenly court, and have eternal life, and live for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Then the Priest says:

N., Abide in peace, and the Lord be with you. **Amen.**

Making the sign of the Cross over the person, he says:

May the Lord \oplus bless you out of Sion, that you may see the good things of Jerusalem all the days of your life, and have life everlasting. **Amen.**

The service continues with the Mass.

Che Order for Holy Baptism in time of Emergency

If a child or adult be in danger of death, the Priest, coming to the place where the sick person is, shall baptize him, pouring water thrice or even once upon his head in the form of a Cross, saying:

N., I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

In urgent danger, if there be no Baptismal water to be had, the Priest shall use ordinary water.

Then, if he has the Chrism, he shall anoint him, and give the white cloth, and lighted candle as above.

If the person live, all rites omitted shall be supplied later in the Church.

Che Order for Holy Matrimony

The Priest shall ask the banns before all assembled:

Brethren, we are gathered together here, in the sight of God, and his Angels, and all the saints, and in the face of the Church, to join together two bodies, to wit, those of this man and this woman, that henceforth they may be one body; and that they may be two souls in the faith and law of God, to the end that they may earn together eternal life; and whatsoever they have done before this, I charge you all by the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Ghost, that if any of you know any cause why these persons may not be lawfully joined together in matrimony, he do now confess it.

When there is no objection, the Parish Priest questions the man and the woman in the presence of two or three witnesses concerning their consent to the Marriage. First the Priest shall ask the bridegroom, who stands on the right of the woman:

N., wilt thou take *N*. here present for thy lawful wife, according to the rite of our holy Mother, the Church?

The bridegroom shall answer: I will.

Then the Priest shall ask the bride: N., wilt thou take *N*. here present for thy lawful husband, according to the rite of our holy Mother, the Church?

The bride shall answer: I will.

Then the woman is given away by her father or by her friends and the man shall receive her to keep her in the faith of God and his own, and shall hold her right hand in his right hand; and, taught by the Priest, he shall pledge his faithfulness in this manner, saying: I, *N*. take thee *N*. to my wedded wife, to have, and to hold, from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish; and thereto I plight thee my troth.

Then withdrawing her hand, and again joining it, the woman, taught by the Priest shall say:

I, *N*. take thee *N*. to my wedded husband, to have, and to hold, from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish; and thereto I plight thee my troth.

Having both thus pledged their faithfulness, and having joined their hands with his stole, the Priest shall say:

I join you in matrimony. In the Name of the \clubsuit Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Then he shall sprinkle them with holy Water.

Then the bridegroom shall put gold and silver (later to be delivered into the hand of the bride) and the rings upon the salver or book; and the Priest blesses them, saying:

- *V*. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord.
- *R.* Who hath made heaven / and earth.
- V. O Lord, hear / my prayer.
- *R*. And let my cry come un/to thee.
- *V*. The Lord be with / you.
- R. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: Φ Bless, O Lord, these rings, which we Φ bless in thy Name, that they who shall wear them, keeping true faith unto one another, may abide in thy peace and according to thy will, and ever live in mutual love. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then the Priest shall sprinkle the rings with holy Water, in the form of a Cross. And the bridegroom, taking the ring from the hand of the Priest, gives the gold and silver to the bride, and says:

With this ring I thee wed: this gold and silver I thee give: with my body I thee worship: and with all my worldly goods I thee endow.

Then the bridegroom places the ring on the left thumb of the hand of the bride, saying:

In the Name of the Father: *then on the second finger, saying,* and of the Son: *then on the third finger, saying:* and of the Holy Ghost: *lastly on the fourth finger, saying,* Amen. *And there he leaves the ring. The bride now takes the ring to be given to the bridegroom and repeats the same.*

These things being done, the Priest adds:

- *V*. Stablish the thing, O God, which thou hast wrought / in us.
- *R*. For thy temple's sake at Jeru/salem.

SECRET PRAYER

O Lord, we beseech thee, to accept this gift which we present unto thee for the sacred ordinance of matrimony: that this work begun by the bounty of thy goodness may be disposed according to thy will. Through...

Our Father being said, the Priest, before he says Deliver us, stands at the Epistle corner and, turning towards the Bridegroom and Bride kneeling before the Altar, says the following Prayers over them:

Let us pray: Mercifully hearken, O Lord, to these our supplications, and graciously prosper this thine institution which thou hast ordained for the propagation of mankind: that what is joined together by thine authority may be preserved by thine assistance. Through...

Let us pray: O God, who by thy mighty power hast made all things of nothing: who also (after the first beginnings of the world were set in order) didst create for man made after the image of God, woman to be an inseparable helpmeet, insomuch that thou didst cause the body of woman to take her origin from the flesh of man, and didst teach that it should never be lawful to put asunder what thou wast pleased at the beginning to make one:

O God, who didst consecrate the bond of matrimony to such an excellent mystery, that in the covenant of wedlock thou didst foreshadow the sacrament of Christ and his Church: Look mercifully upon these thy servants, that this man may love his wife, according to thy Word, (as Christ did love his spouse the Church, who gave himself for it, loving and cherishing it even as his own flesh;)

O God, through whom woman is joined to man, and mankind in the beginning was endowed with that blessing, which alone hath not been taken away either by the punishment of original sin or by the judgment of the flood: look mercifully upon this thine handmaid, who, coming to be joined in matrimony, seeketh thy protection and defence: may the bond of love and peace abide in her: may she be wedded faithful and chaste in Christ, and ever be a follower of holy matrons: may she be loving to her husband, as Rachel: wise, as Rebecca: may she be faithful and live long, as Sara:

Let the father of lies have no dominion over them by reason of their transgression: may they continue steadfast in the faith and the commandments: may they cleave to one marriage bed, and flee unlawful communications: may they be strengthened by the spirit of discipline: may they be grave and modest, honorable and chaste, instructed in heavenly doctrine: may they be fruitful in offspring, approved and without offence: may they attain unto the rest of the Blessed and unto the heavenly realms: and may they see their children's children even unto the third and fourth generation, and come to the old age which they desire. Through the same...

Then the Priest turning back to the middle of the Altar, says Deliver us and the rest as usual.

POSTCOMMUNION

We beseech thee, Almighty God: let thy gracious favor accompany the institution of thy providence; that those whom thou hast joined together in lawful union, thou wouldest preserve in lasting peace. Through...

Before blessing the people, the Priest turns to the Bridegroom and Bride and says:

The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob be with you: and may he fulfil his blessing upon you: that ye may see your children's children even unto the third and fourth generation, and thereafter may have eternal life without end: through the help of our Lord Jesus Christ, who with the Father and the Holy Ghost liveth and reigneth God, throughout all ages, world without end. **Amen.**

Then he sprinkles them with holy water and then blesses the people.







Vouchsafe unto *him* the gift of thy heavenly blessing. Defend *him* from the power and assaults of the devil. Protect *him* by thy good Providence from all harm of body and soul. Grant that *he* may be born again unto thee in holy Baptism, be made partaker of thy heavenly grace, abide thy faithful soldier and servant unto *his* life's end, and finally may be admitted to thine eternal glory. Through... The priest then blesses all those present.

The blessing of God Almighty, the ₱ Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit descend upon you, and remain with you always. **Amen**.

BLESSING OF H COMAN HFCER CHILDBIRCH

If a woman after childbirth, according to pious and laudable custom, desires to come to the church to render thanks to God for her safety, and ask a blessing from the Priest, he shall come, vested in surplice and white stole, with a Clerk bearing the holy water vessel, to the door of the church, where he shall sprinkle her with holy water, as she kneels at the threshold, holding a lighted candle; then shall he say:

V. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord. *R*. Who hath made heaven / and earth.



Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then he sprinkles her again with holy Water, saying:

The peace and blessing of God almighty, the \oplus Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, descend upon thee, and remain with thee alway. **Amen.**

Blessing for the Gift of Children

Let us pray: Almighty and merciful God, who created all things from nothing, fashioned man in thine own image, and sanctified the union of marriage commanding mankind to be fruitful and multiply: look graciously upon this blessed union of husband and wife as they seek refuge and help in thee. Grant that there be such mercy, peace and joy in their midst that there be no work of Satan found in them. According to thy gracious will, \oplus let them be fruitful, and see their children's children even unto the third and fourth generation, and come to the old age which they desire. And the Priest sprinkles the couple with Holy Water.

Visitation of the Sick

All the following prayers may be said or omitted at the discretion of the Priest, as time and the condition of the sick person may demand.

Upon entering the sick person's room the Priest says:

V. Peace be to this house.*R*. And to all that dwell in it.

In the sick room the Priest sprinkles the sick person, the bed and the room, and says:

Thou shalt purge me, O Lord, with hyssop, and I shall be clean: thou shalt wash me and I shall be whiter than snow.

Then he ministers to the sick person in this or other like manner. And he may say the following Psalm over the sick person.



Then he sprinkles him (her) with holy Water.

Any of the following Psalms and Gospels may be read at the discretion of the Priest or the desire of the sick person; and before any Gospel the Priest shall say:

V. The Lord be with you. *R*. And with thy spirit.

And signing himself and, if he be a male, likewise the sick person, if he cannot sign himself.

V. The Continuation of the holy Gospel according to *N*. *R*. **Glory be to thee, O Lord.**

Psalm 6. Mat. 8: 5-13 Psalm 16. Mark 16:14-18 Psalm 20. Luke 4:38-40 Psalm 86. John 5:1-14 Psalm 91. John 1:1-14

Che Blessing of a Sick Child

The Priest, when he comes to the place where the Child is, shall say:

Peace be to / this house. *R*. And to all that dwell / in it.

Then, in silence he sprinkles the child, the bystanders, and the room, with holy Water, and this done, recites Psalm 113.

Through... Amen.

Let us pray: O Father of mercies, and God of all comfort, who dost care for thy creation with manifold loving-kindness, and dost pour forth the grace of healing not only on the soul but also on the body; vouchsafe to raise up this sick child from *his (her)* bed of suffering, and restore *him (her)* whole in mind and body to thy holy Church and to *his (her)* parents; that, growing in wisdom and in favour with thee and with men, *he (she)* may serve thee, all the days that thou shalt add unto *his (her)* life, in holiness and righteousness, and may render thanks, as is most justly due, for these thy mercies. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Let us pray: O everlasting God, who hast ordained and constituted the services of Angels and men in a wonderful order; mercifully grant, that as thy holy Angels always do thee service in heaven, so by thy appointment they may succour and defend the life of this *boy (girl)* on earth. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

And laying his right hand upon the head of the sick child, he adds:

They shall lay their hands upon the sick and they shall recover.

May Jesus the Son of Mary, the salvation and Lord of the world, by the intercession of his holy Apostles Peter and Paul and all the Saints, be unto thee merciful and gracious. **Amen.**

Then, if time allow, may be read the following Gospel (while the Priest says The Beginning of the, etc., he makes the sign of the Cross as usual upon himself on forehead, mouth and breast; likewise on the sick Child, if he cannot sign himself):

- *V*. The Lord be with you.
- *R*. And with thy spirit.
- *R*. Glory be to thee, O Lord.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not anything made that was made; in him was life, and the life was the light of men; and the light shineth in darkness, and the darkness comprehended it not. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the light, that all men through him might believe. He was not that light, but was sent to bear witness of that light. That was the true light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. He came unto his own, and his own received him not. But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his Name; which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us; and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the Only-begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. *R*. **Thanks be to God.**

And finally he shall bless the child, saying:

The blessing of God Almighty, the \clubsuit Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, descend upon thee, and remain with thee alway. **Amen.**

Then he sprinkles him with holy Water.

Che Sacrament of Penance

The penitent, on kneeling before the Priest, at once says: **Bless me, Father, for I have sinned**; and the Priest forthwith gives the blessing:

The Lord be in thy heart and upon thy lips, that thou mayest meetly and rightly confess thy sins, in the Name of the \bigstar Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Amen**.

The penitent then enumerates his sins, and, if desired, the Priest will give him counsel and advice, and before pronouncing absolution he may impose a penance. When the Priest wishes to absolve a penitent, after a penance enjoined and accepted, he shall say:

Almighty God have mercy upon thee, forgive thee thy sins, and bring thee to everlasting life. **Amen.**

Then raising his right hand toward the penitent, he says: The almighty and merciful Lord grant unto thee pardon, absolution, and remission of thy sins. Amen. Our Lord Jesus Christ absolve thee; and I by his authority absolve thee from every bond of excommunication and interdict, so far as I have power, and thou hast need. Furthermore I absolve thee from thy sins, in the Name of the # Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen. Our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath left power to his Church to absolve all sinners who truly repent and believe in him, of his great mercy forgive thee from all thy sins; in the Name of the # Father, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen of the Holy Ghost thee from all thy sins; in the Name of the # Father, and of the Son and of the Name of the # Father, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen of the Holy Ghost thee from all thy sins; in the Name of the # Father, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Or the following form may be used:

The Penitent begins: Bless me, Father, for I have sinned.

The Priest responds: The Lord be in thy heart and upon thy lips, that so thou mayest worthily confess all thy sins; In the Name of the Father, and of the # Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

The Penitent then makes his Confession, using the following or a similar formula: I confess to Almighty God, to all the Saints, and to thee, Father, that I have sinned very much, in thought, word, deed, and omission, by my own great fault. Since my last confession which was ______, I have committed these sins:

He confesses his sins and continues: For these and all other sins which I cannot now remember, I am very sorry. I will try to do better, and I humbly ask pardon of God; and of you Father, I ask for penance, advice and absolution. Amen.

After the Confession is ended, the Priest may address a few words of counsel to the penitent, and may assign a suitable penance. When the Priest wishes to absolve a penitent, after a penance enjoined and accepted, he shall say:

Almighty God have mercy upon thee, forgive thee thy sins, and bring thee to everlasting life. **Amen.** The Almighty and merciful Lord grant thee pardon, \blacksquare absolution, and remission of thy sins. **Amen.** Our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath left power to his Church to absolve all sinners who truly repent and believe in him, of his great mercy forgive thee thine offenses: And by his authority committed unto me, absolve thee from all thy sins, In the Name of the Father, and of the \blacksquare Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Amen.** May the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ, the prayers of his holy Mother the Blessed Virgin Mary, and of all the Saints, together with whatsoever good thou hast done, or evil thou hast endured, be unto thee for the forgiveness of sins, the increase of grace, and the reward of eternal life: And the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the \blacksquare Son, and the Holy Ghost, be upon thee and remain with thee always. **Amen.** Go in peace, the Lord hath put away all thy sins. And pray for me, a sinner.

When grave necessity presses in danger of death, in place of all the above, the Priest may say briefly:

I absolve thee from all censures and sins, in the Name of the \blacksquare Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

Communion of the Sick

Upon entering the room the Priest makes preparation and says

V. Peace be to / this house. *R*. And to all that dwell / in it.

The Priest then takes Holy Water and sprinkles the sick person and the room while saying

Thou shalt purge me, * O Lord, with hyssop, and I shall be clean: thou shalt wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. *Ps.51:1.* Have mercy upon me, O God: after thy great goodness. *V.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son; and to the Holy Ghost; *R.* As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen. Thou shalt purge me...

V. O Lord, show thy mercy up/on us;

R. And grant us thy salva/tion.

- V. O Lord, hear / my prayer;
- *R*. And let my cry come un/to thee.
- *V*. The Lord be with / you;
- *R*. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: Graciously hear us, O Lord Holy, Father Almighty, Everlasting God: and vouchsafe to send thy holy Angel from heaven; to guard and cherish, to protect and visit, and to defend all who dwell in this place. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The following general confession is then said, unless a private confession is made

I confess to God Almighty, to Blessed Mary Ever-Virgin, to blessed Michael the Archangel, to blessed John the Baptist, to the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, to all the Saints, and to thee, father, that I have sinned exceedingly in thought, word and deed, by my fault, by my own fault, by my own most grievous fault. Wherefore I beg blessed Mary Ever-Virgin, blessed Michael the Archangel, blessed John the Baptist, the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, all the Saints, and thee, father, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

V. God Almighty have mercy upon *you*, forgive *you your* sins, and bring *you* to everlasting life. **Amen**.

V. The Almighty and merciful Lord grant unto us pardon, \square absolution, and remission of our sins. **Amen.**

The Priest then takes the Sacrament from the Pyx and raises it saying

The Priest and People respond three times,

Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my soul shall be healed.

The people then say this prayer of preparation before receiving the Sacrament:

I believe, O Lord, and I confess that thou art truly the Christ, the Son of the living God, who didst come into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief. And I believe that this is truly thine own immaculate Body, and that this is truly thine own precious Blood. Wherefore I pray thee, have mercy upon me and forgive my transgressions both voluntary and involuntary, of word and of deed, of knowledge and of ignorance; and make me worthy to partake without condemnation of thine immaculate Mysteries, unto remission of my sins and unto life everlasting. Amen. Of thy Mystic Supper, O Son of God, accept me today as a communicant: for I will not speak of thy Mystery to thine enemies, neither will I give thee a kiss as did Judas; but like the thief will I confess thee: Remember me, O Lord, in thy Kingdom. Not unto judgment nor unto condemnation be my partaking of thy Holy Mysteries, O Lord, but unto the healing of soul and body.

The Priest administers the Sacrament to the sick person saying

The Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ preserve thy soul unto everlasting life.

The Priest cleanses his fingers and then says

V. The Lord be with you.

R. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: O Lord holy, Father almighty, everlasting God, we faithfully beseech thee that the most Sacred Body of our Lord Jesus Christ thy Son, which our *brother (sister)* hath received, may avail for the healing both of body and soul: who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. **Amen.**

The Blessing of God almighty, the \clubsuit Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, descend upon *you* and remain with *you* always. **Amen.**

Che Order of Hdministering the Sacrament of Unction

In case of necessity, it suffices to anoint one sense only, or more fittingly the forehead, with this shorter form:

Through this holy \oplus Unction the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss. Amen.

But the obligation remains, when the danger ceases, of supplying each of the anointings and all the prayers. If there be doubt whether the sick person yet lives, the Priest shall anoint conditionally saying:

If thou livest, through this holy ₱ Unction, etc.

The Priest, who is to administer the Sacrament of Extreme Unction, shall take care that there be made ready, as far as possible, in the sick person's house, a table covered with a white cloth, and a vessel, wherein is cotton-wool or the like, divided into six small pellets, for wiping the places anointed; bread crumbs for cleansing the fingers; water for washing the Priest's hands, and a wax candle, to give him light as he anoints.

Then with the Clergy or at least with one Clerk, who carries a Cross, the holy Water with sprinkler, and the Ritual, the Parish Priest himself takes the vessel of sacred Oil, enclosed in a bag of violet silk, and carries it with care; for greater safety he may hang it around his neck. No bell is rung.

When he comes to the place where the sick person lies, the Priest entering the room, says:

V. Peace be to this house.*R*. And to all that dwell in it.

Having placed the Oil upon the table and (if not already vested) having put on surplice and violet stole, the Priest gives the sick person a Cross to kiss. Then he shall sprinkle him, the bystanders, and the room, in the form of a Cross, saying:

Thou shalt purge me, O Lord, with hyssop, and I shall be clean: thou shalt wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

If the sick person wishes to confess, he shall hear him and absolve him. Then he shall comfort him, and, if time permit, briefly admonish him concerning the power and efficacy of this Sacrament.

Then he says:

- *V*. Our help is in the Name of the Lord.
- *R*. Who hath made heaven and earth.
- *V*. The Lord be with you.
- *R*. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: Let there enter into this house, O Lord, Jesu Christ, with the coming of us unworthy, everlasting happiness, divine prosperity, serene gladness, fruitful charity and everlasting health: let no evil spirits approach this place: may Angels of peace be present, and all evil discord far removed from this house: magnify upon us thy holy Name, O Lord, and \oplus bless our conversation; sanctify our unworthy coming, who art holy and gracious, and abidest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, world without end. **Amen.**

Let us pray and beseech our Lord Jesus Christ, that in blessing he may \oplus bless this dwelling-place, and all that inhabit it, and give to them a good Angel guardian, and make them so to serve him, that they may consider the wondrous things of his law: may he turn from them all adverse powers: deliver them from all fear, and from every disquiet, and vouchsafe to preserve them in safety in this dwelling-place: Who with the Father and the Holy Ghost liveth and reigneth, world without end. **Amen.**

Let us pray: Graciously hear us, O Lord holy, Father almighty, everlasting God: and vouchsafe to send from heaven thy holy Angel to guard and cherish, protect, visit and defend all who dwell in this place. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

These prayers, if time does not allow, may be omitted in whole or in part. Then the general Confession is made in the accustomed manner (see p. 75), and the Priest says in the singular number:

Almighty God, have mercy upon thee *(or if there be several* you), etc. The almighty... grant unto thee.

The Priest, extending his right hand over the head of the sick person, says:

In the Name of the \oplus Father, and of the \oplus Son, and of the \oplus Holy Ghost, may there be extinguished in the all power of the devil, through the imposition of our hands, and through the invocation of the glorious and holy Virgin Mary Mother of God, and of her illustrious Spouse Joseph, and of all the holy Angels, Archangels, Patriarchs, Prophets, Apostles, Martyrs, Confessors and Virgins, and of all the Saints. **Amen.**

Then, dipping his thumb in the holy Oil, he anoints the sick person in the form of a Cross on the parts mentioned below, adapting the words of the form to the appropriate place in this manner:

At the eyes.

Through this holy \oplus Unction, and his most tender mercy, the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss by seeing. Amen.

The Clerk, if he be in Holy Orders, or the Priest himself, after each anointing shall wipe the place anointed with a fresh pellet of cottonwool, and place it in a clean vessel, and afterwards carry it to the Church, burn it, and cast the ashes into the sacrarium.

At the ears.

Through this holy \oplus Unction, and his most tender mercy, the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss by hearing. Amen.

At the nostrils.

Through this holy \oplus Unction, and his most tender mercy, the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss by smelling. Amen.

At the mouth, the lips being closed.

Through this holy \oplus Unction, and his most tender mercy, the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss by tasting and speaking. Amen.

At the hands.

Through this holy \oplus Unction, and his most tender mercy, the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss by touching. Amen.

And note, that the hands of Priests are not anointed on the inside, but on the outside.

At the feet.

Through this holy \oplus Unction, and his most tender mercy, the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss by walking. Amen.

This unction of the feet may be omitted for any reasonable cause.

All these things being done, the Priest rubs his thumb with bread crumbs, washes his hands, and wipes them with the towel. The water and bread shall in due course be cast into the sacrarium or the fire. Then he says:

Kyrie eleison, **Christe eleison**, Kyrie eleison. Our Father...

Let us pray: O Lord God, who through thine Apostle James hast said: Is any sick among you? Let him call for the elders of the Church and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the Name of the Lord: and the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up: and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him; cure, we beseech thee, O our Redeemer, by the grace of the Holy Ghost, the weakness of this sick person; heal *his (her)* wounds and put away *his (her)* sins; cast out from *him (her)* all pain of mind and body and mercifully give back to *him (her)* full health, both inwardly and outwardly, that, being restored by the help of thy mercy, *he (she)* may return to *his (her)* duties as of old: Who with the Father and the same Holy Ghost livest and reignest God, world without end. **Amen.**

Let us pray: Look, O Lord, we beseech thee, upon this thy *servant* (*handmaid*) *N*., languishing in weakness of body, and comfort again the soul which thou hast created: that, being amended by thy chastisement, *he* (*she*) may feel *himself* (*herself*) to be saved by thy healing. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Let us pray: O Lord holy, Father almighty, everlasting God, who in pouring the grace of thy blessing upon sick bodies dost preserve by thy manifold goodness thy handy-work: graciously assist us who call upon thy Name; deliver thy *servant (handmaid)* from *his (her)* sickness, and give *him (her)* health; raise *him (her)* up by thy right hand; strengthen *him (her)* by thy might; protect *him (her)* by thy power; and with all the prosperity which *he* (*she*) desires restore *him* (*her*) to thy holy Church. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

During the anointings the bystanders should say suitable prayers for the sick person, e.g., one or more of the Penitential Psalms (6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, 143) or the Litany of the Saints (p. 84).

At the end he may give brief and salutary exhortations to enable the sick person to die in the Lord, and to strengthen him (her) to put to flight the temptations of evil spirits.


Finally he should leave with him (her) holy water and a Cross, that he may frequently look up on it, and according to his (her) devotion kiss it and embrace it.

He should also warn the relatives and servants of the sick man (woman) to send at once for the Parish Priest, if the disease grows worse, that he may help the dying man (woman), and commend his (her) soul to God; but if death is at hand, the Priest, before he departs, shall duly commend the soul to God.


When this Sacrament is administered to several sick persons at the same time, the Priest shall present the Cross to each to be devoutly kissed, and shall say all the prayers which precede and follow the anointing once for all in the plural number; but he shall perform the anointings with their respective forms separately on each sick person.



Almighty and everlasting God, who hast dominion both of the living and of the dead, and hast mercy upon all whom thou knowest will be thine in faith and works: we humbly beseech thee; that all those for whom we are minded to pour forth our prayers, whether in this present world they still be held in the flesh, or being delivered from the body have passed into that which is to come, may at the intercession of all the Saints obtain of thy bountiful goodness the remission of all their sins. Then he gives the image of our Savior crucified to the sick person to kiss, and by effectual words lifts him up to hope of eternal salvation, and sets the image before him, that, looking upon it, he may receive hope of salvation.

Then, a candle being lighted, he kneels and with all present he prays:

Lord, have mercy on *him (her)*. Christ, have mercy on *him (her)*. Lord, have mercy on *him (her)*.

All holy Angels, and Archangels, pray for him (her).
Holy Abel, pray for him (her).

May thy place today be found in peace, and thy dwelling in holy Sion. Through the same Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

O merciful God, O gracious God, O God, who according to the multitude of thy mercies dost blot out the sins of them that repent, and by pardon and remission dost do away the guilt of their former offences: look mercifully on this thy *servant (handmaid) N.*, and graciously hearken unto *him (her)*, who by sincere confession doth seek remission of all *his (her)* sins. Renew in *him (her)*, most loving Father, whatsoever hath been corrupted by earthly frailty, or decayed by the fraud of the devil: and join this member, which thou hast redeemed, to the unity of the body of the Church. Have mercy, O Lord, upon *his (her)* groaning, have mercy on *his (her)* tears: and forasmuch as *he (she)* putteth *his (her)* whole trust in thy mercy admit *him (her)* to the Sacrament of thy reconciliation. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Note that any or all of the following forms of devotion may be used, as time may permit.

I commend thee, dearest *brother (sister)*, to almighty God, and commit thee to his care, whose creature thou art; that when thou shalt have paid the debt of all mankind by death, thou mayest return to thy Maker, who formed thee out of the dust of the earth.

When, therefore, thy soul shall depart from the body, may the shining company of the Angels meet thee: may the council of the Apostles draw near to thee: may the triumphant army of white-robed Martyrs come to meet thee: may the glorious band of Confessors, crowned with lilies, encompass thee: may the choir of joyful Virgins receive thee: and may an embrace of blessed repose enfold thee in the bosom of the Patriarchs: may Saint Joseph, the most loving Patron of the dying, lift thee up to great hope: may the holy Virgin Mary, Mother of God, graciously turn her eyes toward thee: may the face of Jesus Christ appear to thee gentle and joyful, and may He give thee a place among those who stand before him for ever.

Mayest thou never know the horror of darkness, nor the flames of hell, nor the bitter pains of eternal death. May the most wicked Satan, with his followers give way before thee: may he tremble at thy coming in the company of Angels, and flee away into the confusion of everlasting night. Let God arise, and let his enemies be scattered: let them also that hate him flee before him. Like as the smoke vanisheth, so shalt thou drive them away: and like as wax melteth at the fire, so let the ungodly perish at the presence of God: but let the righteous be glad and rejoice before God. May all the legions of hell be confounded and put to shame, and may the ministers of Satan not dare to stop thee in thy way.

May Christ, who was crucified for thee, deliver thee from torment. May Christ, who vouchsafed to die for thee, deliver thee from eternal death. May Christ, the Son of the living God, place thee in the ever-verdant pastures of his paradise: and may he, the true Shepherd number thee among his sheep. May he absolve thee from all thy sins, and place thee at his right hand, in the portion of his elect. Mayest thou behold thy Redeemer face to face, and standing alway in his presence, gaze with happy eyes on the open vision of truth. And thus placed amongst the ranks of the Blessed, mayest thou enjoy the sweetness of the contemplation of God for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Receive, O Lord, thy *servant (handmaid)*, into the place of salvation for which *he (she)* hopeth through thy mercy. **Amen.**

Deliver, O Lord, the soul of thy *servant (handmaid)*, from all the dangers of hell, and from the bonds of punishment, and from all tribulations. **Amen.**

Deliver, O Lord, the soul of thy *servant (handmaid)*, as thou didst deliver Enoch and Elias from the common death of the world. **Amen**.

Deliver, O Lord, the soul of thy *servant (handmaid)*, as thou didst deliver Noah from the flood. **Amen.**

Deliver, O Lord, the soul of thy *servant (handmaid)*, as thou didst deliver Daniel from the den of lions. **Amen.**

Deliver, O Lord, the soul of thy *servant (handmaid)*, as thou didst deliver the three children from the burning fiery furnace, and from the hand of the unjust king. **Amen.**

Deliver, O Lord, the soul of thy *servant (handmaid)*, as thou didst deliver Susanna from false accusation. **Amen.**

Deliver, O Lord, the soul of thy *servant (handmaid)*, as thou didst deliver David from the hand of King Saul, and from the hand of Goliath. **Amen.**

Deliver, O Lord, the soul of thy *servant (handmaid)*, as thou didst deliver Peter and Paul from prison. **Amen.**

And as thou didst deliver the most blessed Thecla, thy Virgin and Martyr, from three most cuel torments, so vouchsafe to deliver the soul of this thy *servant (handmaid)*, and make *him (her)* to rejoice with thee in heavenly felicity. **Amen.**

We commend to thee, O Lord, the soul of thy *servant (handmaid) N*., and we beseech thee, O Lord Jesu Christ, Savior of the world, that thou, who for *him (her)* sake didst of thy mercy come down to earth, wouldest not refuse *him (her)* a place in the bosom of thy Patriarchs. Acknowledge, O Lord, thy creature not made by strange gods, but by thee the only living and true God: for there is none other God beside thee, nor any works like unto thy works.

Make *his (her)* soul, O Lord, to rejoice in thy presence, and remember not *his (her)* old sins and excesses which have been provoked by the violence of evil desire. For though *he (she)* hath sinned, yet hath *he (she)* not denied the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost, but hath believed, and hath had a zeal for God within *him (her)* and hath faithfully adored God, who made all things.

Remember not, O Lord, we beseech thee, the sins of *his (her)* youth and *his (her)* ignorances: but, according to thy great mercy, be mindful of *him (her)* in the brightness of thy glory. Let the heavens be opened to *him (her)*, let the Angels rejoice with *him (her)*. Receive thy *servant (handmaid)*, O Lord, into thy kingdom.

Let Saint Michael, the Archangel of God, who merited the princedom of the heavenly host, receive *him (her)*. Let the holy Angels of God come forth to meet *him (her)* and lead *him (her)* to the heavenly city Jerusalem. Let blessed Peter the Apostle, to whom by God were given the keys of the kingdom of heaven, receive *him (her)*. Let Saint Paul the Apostle, who was counted worthy to be a

vessel of election, assist *him (her)*. Let Saint John the chosen Apostle of God, to whom were revealed the secrets of heaven, intercede for *him (her)*. Let all the holy Apostles, to whom was given by the Lord the power of binding and loosing, pray for *him (her)*.

Let all the Saints and Elect of God, who in this world have suffered torments for the Name of Christ, intercede for *him (her)*, that, loosed from the bonds of the flesh, *he (she)* may be worthy to attain unto the glory of the heavenly kingdom, through the gift of our Lord Jesus Christ: Who with the Father and the Holy Ghost, liveth and reigneth for ever and ever. **Amen.**

May the most merciful Virgin Mary, Mother of God who is a most kind comforter of the afflicted, commend the spirit of N, the *servant (handmaid)* of God, to her Son, that by her motherly intercession *he (she)* may not fear the terrors of death; but may enter rejoicing in her company into the mansion of that heavenly country which *his (her)* soul desireth. **Amen.**

To thee, I flee, holy Joseph, Patron of the dying; to thee, at whose blessed passing Jesus and Mary stood by, keeping watch; by this two-fold and most dear pledge, I earnestly commend the soul of this *servant (handmaid)* N., now laboring in its last agony; that through thy protection it may be delivered from the snares of the devil and from eternal death, and may be worthy to attain unto everlasting joys. If the soul still lingers, there may be read this Gospel: John 17:1-26, and The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John (John 18 and 19).

The typical order for funerals consists of:

The Reception of the Body, p. 106.
The Office of the Dead, Vespers, p. 110 or Lauds, p. 118 according to the time of day.
The Requiem Mass according to the form found in the Orthodox Missal.
The Absolution of the Departed, p. 127.

Then at the grave:

The Blessing of the Grave (if not already blessed), p. 141. The Committal, p. 142.

Note that if the body remains in the Church through the night, psalms may be sung continually.

Che Reception of the Body

At the appointed time the clergy and others assemble in the church, and candles are distributed to the clergy and lighted. The priest and acolytes go to the doors of the church to meet the body. As the priest sprinkles the body with Holy Water, he sings the antiphon and Psalm on one note:

Then shall be said: Our Fa/ther...

And the prayer continues in silence as far as:

V. And lead us not into tempta/tion.*R*. But deliver us from e/vil.

When Lauds is said at a time other than the day of death or burial, Psalm 130 (p. 106) is sung here without the Gloria Patri. It may be sung on one note. Then, at all times, follows:







Che Absolution of the Departed

After Mass, the Priest, vested in black cope, and other ministers take their places at the bier. The Priest stands at the foot of the bier; the crucifer stands at the head of the bier, between two acolytes bearing lighted candles. The Priest says the following prayer, which is not altered when said for a woman:



Therefore, we beseech thee, let not the sentence of thy judgment fall upon him, whom the faithful prayer of Christian people commendeth unto thee: but, by the succor of thy grace, let him who, while he lived, was sealed with the sign of the Holy Trinity, may be found worthy to escape the avenging judgment. Who livest and reignest, world without end. **Amen.**


This Responsory is then said or sung by the cantor(s).





And the remainder of the prayer is said silently as the priest censes the pall and sprinkles it with holy water, until










Che Burial of Children

The following service is to be used at the burial of children who die before they come to years of discretion (that is, normally, under eight years of age). At the funeral of such children the church bells should be rung joyfully, not tolled as for adults. When a Child who has been baptized, but has not reached the years of discretion, dies, he should be clothed suitably according to age; and a crown of flowers or aromatic and sweet-scented herbs - signifying the integrity and virginity of his body - should be placed upon the head.

The Parish Priest, vested in surplice and white stole, accompanied by a Clerk bearing holy Water, and with others of the Clergy, if any be present, preceded by a Cross borne without its staff, shall come to the place where the dead Child is, and sprinkling the body with holy Water, shall say:

Antiphon:



Bless-ed be the Name of the Lord: from this time forth for



ev-er-more.



If Mass is to be celebrated, a Votive Mass of the Holy Angels, if the rubrics permit, may be said, otherwise the Mass of the Day. Then the Priest and Assistants shall stand around the body, as at the Absolution, and there shall be said the antiphon:







Che Blessing of a Grave

Note that these prayers are omitted when if the grave has previously been blessed or if the cemetery has been consecrated.

The following antiphon may be sung or said (the chant is found on *p. 131*).

Into paradise may the Angels lead thee: at thy coming may the Martyrs receive thee, and bring thee into the holy city Jerusalem. May the choirs of Angels receive thee, and with Lazarus, once poor, mayest thou have eternal rest.

Let us pray: O God, by whose mercy the souls of the faithful are at rest, vouchsafe to \oplus bless this grave, and appoint thy holy Angel to guard it: and absolve from every bond of sin the soul of *him (her)* whose body is buried herein: that in thee and with thy saints *he (she)* may rejoice everlastingly. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then shall the priest sprinkle with Holy Water and then incense the body of the departed and the grave.

Che Committal

The burial may continue with the Benedictus and antiphon, or with the following prayers.

Let us pray: Almighty God, Father of mercies and giver of all comfort: deal graciously, we pray thee, with all those who mourn, that casting every care on thee, they may know the consolation of thy love; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then, if a scripture reading and brief homily are desired they may be given here.

The Burial Sentences may be said, as follows:

All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out. He that raised up Jesus from the dead will also quicken our mortal bodies, by His Spirit that dwelleth in us. Where my heart is glad, and my glory rejoiceth; my flesh also shall rest in hope. Thou shalt show me the path of life; in thy presence is the fulness of joy, and at thy right hand there is pleasure for evermore.

Then, while earth is cast upon the coffin in the form of a cross, the Priest may say these words.

Unto almighty God, we commend the soul of *N*. our *brother (sister)* departed, we commit *his (her)* body to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust; in sure and certain hope of the Resurrection unto eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord; at whose coming in glorious majesty to judge the world, the earth and the sea shall give up their dead; and the corruptible bodies of those



According to the custom the Priest may remain and say extraliturgical prayers.

On returning to the sacristy he may say Psalm 130 with the antiphon If thou, Lord and suitable prayers.

The Blessings

The reserved blessings marked (R) in the table of contents may only be given lawfully by the following:

- A. All bishops.
- B. Deans within their deaneries.
- C. Parish Priests for churches in their Parish, and Rectors of churches for their churches.
- D. Priests delegated by the Ordinary of the place.
- *E.* Religious Superiors and Priests delegated by them for their own Churches and for Churches of nuns subject to them.

Other blessings not marked (R) may be given by any Priest. In all blessings outside Mass the Priest should wear at least a surplice and a stole of the color of the Season, unless otherwise noted.

He must always bless standing and with head uncovered. At the beginning of each blessing, unless otherwise noted, he shall say:

V. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord.

R. Who hath made heaven / and earth.

V. The Lord be with / you.

R. And with thy spi/rit.

Then he shall say the appropriate Prayer or Prayers. Afterwards he shall sprinkle with blessed Water (and, if so noted, cense) the object, saying nothing. When the Priest is to bless anything, he shall have a server with a vessel of blessed Water, and this book of the Ritual.

He shall take care not to place anything unseemly, such as eatables, on the Altar for blessing; but anything of that kind should be placed on a table, made ready in a suitable place.

Che Order for the Blessing of Mater

Salt and the water to be blessed are made ready in the Sacristy. On Sundays the Priest who is to celebrate the Mass, if he himself bless the water, wears alb with stole of the color of the day. At other times the Priest vests in surplice with violet stole.

V. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord. R. Who hath made heaven / and earth.

Then he straightway begins the exorcism of the salt. Note that previously blessed salt may be used.

I adjure thee, O creature of salt, by the living \textcircled God, by the true \oiint God, by the holy \oiint God: by God who commanded thee to be cast by the prophet Elisha into the water to heal the barrenness thereof: that thou become salt exorcised for the health of them that believe: be thou to all them that take thee effectual for healing of soul and body, let all vain imaginations, wickedness, and subtlety of the wiles of the devil, let every unclean spirit flee and depart from the place where thou shalt be sprinkled, being adjured by him who shall come to judge the quick and the dead, and the world by fire. **Amen.**

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, we humbly beseech thine infinite mercy: that thou wouldest vouchsafe of thy lovingkindness to \oplus bless and \oplus sanctify this creature of salt, which thou hast given for the use of mankind; that it may avail unto all that take of it for health of body and soul: and let all such things as shall be touched or sprinkled therewith be free from all uncleanness, and from all assaults of spiritual wickedness. Through... **Amen**.

He continues with the exorcism of the water:

I adjure thee, O creature of water, in the Name of God the \clubsuit Father almighty, in the Name of \clubsuit Jesus Christ his Son, our Lord, and by

the power of the \bigstar Holy Ghost: that thou become water exorcised for the putting to flight of all the power of the enemy, and that thou be enabled to root out and expel the enemy himself with his apostate angels by the power of the same Jesus Christ our Lord: who shall come to judge the quick and the dead, and the world by fire. **Amen**.

Let us pray: O God, who for the salvation of mankind hast ordained in thy chiefest sacraments the use of the substance of water: mercifully assist us who call upon thee, and pour the power of thy # benediction upon this element, made ready by divers cleansings: that this thy creature, in the service of thy mysteries, may effectually receive thy divine grace for the casting forth of devils and the healing of diseases, that whatsoever in the dwellings or abodes of thy faithful people shall be sprinkled with this water may be free from all uncleanness and delivered from all evil: let not the spirit of pestilence abide therein, nor the breath of corruption; let all the snares of the unseen enemy depart from thence: and let all such things as are contrary to the health and peace of them that dwell therein be put to flight by the sprinkling of this water; that, as through the invocation of thy holy Name we entreat for them thy saving health, so they may be defended against all assaults. Through... Amen.

Here he shall thrice put salt into the water in the form of a cross, saying once:

Let this commingling of salt and water be wrought in the Name of the \clubsuit Father, and of the \clubsuit Son, and of the \clubsuit Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

Let us pray: O God, who art the author of strength invincible, the King of the empire that none may overcome, who art ever glorious in thy triumphs: who dost quell the might of the dominion that is against thee, who rulest the raging of the fierce enemy, who dost overthrow by thy power the wickedness of thy foes; we entreat thee, O Lord, and beseech thee in fear and lowliness: that thou wouldest graciously behold this creature of salt and water, and mercifully enlighten and sanctify it with the dew of thy loving-kindness; that, wheresoever it shall be sprinkled, all the snares of the unclean spirit may through the invocation of thy holy Name be driven away, and the dread of the poisonous serpent be cast forth: and in all places let the presence of the Holy Ghost be vouchsafed unto us who call upon thy mercy. Through...in the unity of the same Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

After the blessing of the water, the Priest on Sundays, before he begins the Mass, sprinkles the Altar, then himself, the Ministers and the people, as is prescribed in the Missal, and given below.

Che Blessing of the People with Blessed Mater

Before the Sunday Liturgy, unless a Procession is ordered, the following Memento of Baptism is sung, while the people are sprinkled with Holy Water. The Priest wears the cope held back by the deacon and subdeacon (or by acolytes).



Blessing of Altar Cloths and Altar Linen

Blessing of Corporals

Let us pray: Most gracious Lord, whose power is unspeakable, and whose mysteries are celebrated with hidden wonders: grant we beseech thee, that this linen cloth may be sanctified by thy merciful sebenediction, that thereon may be consecrated the Body and Blood of our Lord and God Jesus Christ, thy Son: Who with thee liveth and reigneth in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God: world without end. **Amen.** Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, vouchsafe to \oplus bless, \oplus sanctify and \oplus consecrate this linen cloth, that it may cover and envelop the Body and Blood of thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ: Who with thee liveth and reigneth in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God: world without end. **Amen.**

Let us pray: Almighty God, shed upon our hands the help of thy blessing: that through our \oplus benediction this linen cloth may be sanctified, and may be made by the grace of thy Holy Spirit a new winding-sheet for the Body and Blood of our Redeemer. Blessing of a Cabernacle or Vessel for Reserving the Most Holy Eucharist

If the Crosses are solemnly blessed and exposed for the veneration of the faithful, this blessing is reserved to the Ordinary, who may, however, delegate the hallowing to another priest. But if the blessing is used privately, any priest may perform it.

Let us pray: Bless, O Lord Jesu Christ, this Cross, whereby thou didst deliver the world from the power of devils, and didst by thy Passion overcome the tempter to sin, who rejoiced in the transgression of the first man through taking of the forbidden tree. *(Here it is sprinkled with holy Water)*. Let this sign of the Cross be hallowed in the Name of the # Father, and of the # Son, and of the # Holy Ghost: and may all, who for the Lord's sake pray and bow themselves before this Cross, find health of body and soul. Through the same Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then shall the Priest and people, devoutly kneeling, venerate and kiss the Cross.

Blessing of a Monstrance for Exposing the Most Holy Sacrament to the Veneration of the Faithful

V. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord.

R. Who hath made heaven / and earth.

V. The Lord be with / you.

R. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, vouchsafe to \textcircled bless and \oiint sanctify this vessel made for the exposing to the veneration of the faithful of the Body of thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ: that all who worship the same thine only-begotten Son in this world with godly affection may in the world to come receive the everlasting reward of their devotion. Through the same Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

And let it be sprinkled with holy Water.

Blessing of a Reliquary

V. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord.

R. Who hath made heaven / and earth.

V. The Lord be with / you.

R. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: Bless, O Lord, this vessel made ready to contain the Relics of thy Saints: and grant; that whosoever shall venerate them with the affection of their hearts may, at the intercession of the same thy Saints, obtain pardon of all their sins and ever be defended against all adversities. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Solemn Blessing of an Image of Our Lord Jesus Christ or the Blessed Virgin Mary or Some Other Saint

If the images, being exposed to public veneration, are solemnly blessed, this blessing is reserved to the Ordinary, who may however delegate it to any Priest. But this blessing may be performed privately by any Priest without leave from the Ordinary.

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, who dost not forbid the painting or carving of the likenesses of thy Saints: to the end that as oft as we look upon them with the eyes of the body, so often, contemplating with the eyes of memory their deeds and sanctity, we may imitate the same: vouchsafe, we beseech thee, to \oplus bless and \oplus sanctify this image, fashioned to the honor and memory of *thine only-begotten Son our Lord Jesus Christ (or the most blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of our Lord Jesus Christ, or blessed N., thine Apostle, or Martyr, or Bishop, or Confessor, or blessed N. Thy Virgin, or Martyr)*: and grant; that whosoever before it shall study humbly to venerate and honor *thine only-begotten Son (or the most blessed Virgin, or the glorious Apostles, or Martyr, or Bishop, or Confessor, or the glorious Virgin, or Martyr)* may by *his (her or their)* intercession obtain in this world grace from thee, and in the world to come glory everlasting. Through *(the same)* Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Blessing of Vessels to Contain the Holy Oils

Dearly beloved, let us pray our Lord God favorably to shine upon this dwelling, to fill this house with godly inhabitants, and ever to defend them with the protection of His divine majesty.

The Blessing of Water, p. 148 may follow, if previously blessed water is not to be used. Then follows:

V. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord.

R. Who hath made heaven / and earth.

V. The Lord be with / you.

R. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: We humbly beseech thee, O God the Father Almighty, on behalf of this house, of them that dwell herein, and of all things belonging to them; that it may please thee to \oplus bless and \oplus sanctify it and to replenish it with all good things; grant unto them, O Lord, abundance of the dew of heaven and of the fatness of the earth for their sustenance and so direct the desires of their hearts that they may effectually obtain thy mercy. At our coming in therefore, vouchsafe to \oplus bless and \oplus sanctify this house, even as thou didst vouchsafe to bless the house of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob: and grant that within the walls of this house the Angels of thy light may dwell, and guard it and them that dwell therein. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with thee and the Holy Spirit liveth and reigneth, ever One God, world without end. **Amen.** The Priest then takes Holy Water and sprinkles the room while saying The Asperges (the music is found in the St. Ambrose Hymnal at #351):



Ant. Thou shalt purge me, * O Lord, with hyssop, and I shall be clean: thou shalt wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. *Ps. 51.* Have mercy upon me, O God: after thy great goodness. *V.* Glory be to the Father... Thou shalt purge me...

V. O Lord, show thy mercy upon / us;

- *R*. And grant us thy salva/tion.
- V. O Lord, hear / my prayer;
- *R*. And let my cry come un/to thee.
- *V*. The Lord be with / you;

The priest is led to other rooms to bless them with holy water. The Litany of Saints, p. 85 or a hymn may be sung. Then, returning to the principal room, he concludes, saying:

Let us pray: O God our Savior, who didst deign to enter under the roof of Zaccheus, unto the salvation of the same and of all who were in the house: do thou, the same Lord, keep safe also from all harm those who have now desired to dwell here, and who together with us, unworthy though we be, do offer unto thee prayers and supplications; blessing this their dwelling and preserving their life free from all evil. For unto thee are due all glory, honor and worship; together with thy Father who is from everlasting, and thine all holy, and good, and life-giving Spirit: now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. **Amen.** Let this house be hallowed; let every unclean spirit fly hence, by the power of our Lord Jesus Christ: may health, joy and cheerfulness be given to all who dwell herein, and may thy Majesty ever protect and preserve them, O Almighty God, who livest and reignest, throughout all ages, world without end. **Amen.**




Blessing of Houses at Pascha

The Parish Priest, or another Priest by his leave, vested in surplice and white stole, with a server, bearing a vessel of blessed water at a convenient time visits the houses of his parish, sprinkling them with the same blessed water.

On entering a house he says:

V. Peace be to / this house.*R*. And to all that dwell / in it.

Then sprinkling the principal rooms and those who live in the house, he says the Vidi Aquam (St. Ambrose Hymnal, #352):



which proceeded from the temple, on the right side thereof, alleluia: and all they to whom that water came were healed every one; and they say, alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. 118.* O give thanks unto the Lord, for he is gracious: and his mercy endureth for ever. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. *The antiphon is repeated:* I beheld water which proceeded from the temple, on the right side thereof, alleluia: and all they to whom that water came were healed every one; and they say, alleluia, alleluia.

V. O Lord, show thy mercy upon us. Allelu/ia.

- *R*. And grant us thy salvation. Allelu/ia.
- V. O Lord, hear / my prayer.
- *R*. And let my cry come un/to thee.
- *V*. The Lord be with / you.
- *R*. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: Graciously hear us, O Lord holy, Father almighty, everlasting God: and as thou didst guard from the destroying Angel the houses of the Hebrews, when they went out of Egypt, being sprinkled with the blood of the lamb, (which pre-figured our Passover wherein Christ is sacrificed); so vouchsafe to send thy holy Angel from heaven to guard, cherish, protect, visit and defend all who dwell in this dwelling-place. Through the same Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then the Priest sprinkles the other rooms in order, saying nothing, or an appropriate hymn may be sung.

Che Blessing of a Domestic Oratory

The Priest on entering shall sprinkle the rooms with holy Water, saying:

Let us pray: O Lord Jesu Christ, who didst command thine Apostles, that into whatsoever house they entered they should pray for peace upon it; \clubsuit sanctify, we beseech thee, by our ministry this house destined for the education of children; pour thy \clubsuit benediction upon it, and abundance of peace; let salvation come to it, even as it came to the house of Zacchaeus, at thy entering; command thine Angels to keep it and to drive far from it all the power of the enemy; fill with

the spirit of knowledge, wisdom and thy fear them that teach therein; nourish with thy heavenly grace them that learn; and grant that they may understand those things which for their salvation they are taught, may keep in their hearts and practice them in their works; and may all that dwell therein please thee by works of every virtue, that they may be worthy to be received hereafter to their everlasting home in heaven. Through thee, O Jesu Christ, Savior of the world, who livest and reignest God, world without end. **Amen.**

Blessing of a Church Bell

Note that this blessing in its longer form is typically reserved for a Bishop, but should a shorter form be required for use by a priest this prayer may be used.

Let us pray: Almighty God, who by thy servant Moses didst command to make two silver trumpets for the convocation of solemn assemblies: be pleased to accept our offering of this bell; ₱ bless, hallow, and sanctify it with thy heavenly benediction, and grant that through this generation, and those that are to come, it may continue to call together thy faithful people to praise and worship thy holy Name. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Blessing of Crops or Harvest

- *V*. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord.
- *R*. Who hath made heaven / and earth.
- *V*. The Lord be with / you.
- *R*. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: O Lord God almighty, who ceasest not to bestow on men abundance of the dew of heaven and the substance of the fatness of the earth: we render thanks to thy most gracious majesty for the fruits that have been gathered, beseeching thy mercy; that thou wouldest vouchsafe to Φ bless, preserve and defend from all harm these crops, which of thy goodness we have received: and grant therewith; that they, whose desire thou hast fulfilled with good things, may glory in thy protection, may continually praise thy mercies, and may so pass through good things temporal, that they lose not the things eternal. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

And let them be sprinkled with holy Water.

Blessing of an Hutomobile

V. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord.

R. Who hath made heaven / and earth.

R. And with thy spi/rit.

Let us pray: Assist us mercifully, O Lord, in these our supplications, and \oplus bless this automobile with thy holy right hand: join unto it thy holy Angels, that they may alway deliver and defend all who ride therein from every peril; and as thou didst give faith and grace by thy Levite Philip unto the man of Ethiopia as he sat upon his chariot and read thy sacred words; so unto thy servants show the way of salvation, that they who by the help of thy grace are ever intent upon good works, may, after all the changes and chances of the journey of this life, be worthy to obtain eternal joys. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

And let it be sprinkled with holy Water.

Blessing of a Ship or Boat

Let us pray: Be favorable, O Lord, unto our supplications, and with thy holy right hand # bless this ship and all them that shall journey therein; even as thou didst vouchsafe to bless the ark of Noah; stretch forth unto them, O Lord, thy right hand, as thou didst stretch it forth unto blessed Peter when he walked upon the sea; and send thy holy Angel from heaven to keep and deliver it always from every peril, together with all that shall be therein: and, all adversities being driven away, preserve thy servants in the haven where they would be, giving them peaceful voyaging: and, their business ended and rightly fulfilled, vouchsafe in due time to bring them again with all gladness to their homes: who livest and reignest world without end. **Amen.**

Order for the Consecration of a Paten and Chalice

A Bishop, wishing to proceed to the consecration of a Chalice, or any vestment or ecclesiastical ornament, should always have a stole about his neck, and may wear a mitre, when it is fitting. This Blessing may be done in any place or at any time that the Bishop may appoint. In the consecration of a Paten, for which the holy Chrism must be made ready, and a vessel of holy water with the sprinkler, the bishop, standing and wearing the mitre, says:

V. Our help is in the Name of / the Lord. *R*. Who hath made heaven / and earth.

Let us pray: Dearly beloved brethren, that the blessing of divine grace may consecrate and sanctify this Paten (*these Patens*), for the breaking thereon of the body of our Lord Jesus Christ, who endured the suffering of the Cross for the salvation of us all.

Then, laying aside the mitre, he says:

V. The Lord be with you.*R*. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, who didst institute the sacrifices of the law, and who didst command the finest wheat flour, scattered among them, to be borne to thy Altar on patens of gold and silver: vouchsafe to \oplus bless, \oplus sanctify and \oplus consecrate this Paten (*these Patens*) for the ministration of the Eucharist of Jesus Christ thy Son, who for our salvation and for that of all willed himself to be sacrificed unto thee, O God the Father, on the gibbet of the Cross, and liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost... **Amen.**

Then the Bishop, receiving the mitre, dipping the thumb of his right hand in the Chrism, makes therewith a Cross over the Paten (each Paten) from rim to rim, and then anoints all the surface with his thumb, saying:

Vouchsafe, O Lord God, to \oplus consecrate and \oplus sanctify this Paten through this anointing, and our \oplus benediction in Christ Jesu our Lord: Who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost... Amen.

Then, still standing with the mitre, he proceeds to the blessing of the Chalice, saying:

Let us pray, dearly beloved brethren, that our God and Lord may sanctify by the inspiration of his heavenly grace this Chalice (*these Chalices*) to be consecrated to the use of his service: and that he may join the fulness of divine favor to this consecration by man. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then laying aside the mitre, he says:

V. The Lord be with you. *R*. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: Vouchsafe, O Lord our God, to P bless this Chalice (*these Chalices*), fashioned by the godly devotion of thy servants to the use of thy ministry, and to fill it (*them*) with that \oiint{P} sanctification, wherewith thou didst fill the hallowed chalice of Melchisedech thy servant: and let that which by art or the nature of metal cannot be worthy of thine Altars be sanctified by thy \oiint{P} benediction. Through... Amen.

Then, receiving the mitre, he makes a cross with the thumb of his right hand from the Chrism within the Chalice itself (each Chalice) from lip to lip and then anoints the whole of the interior saying:

Vouchsafe, O Lord God, to Φ consecrate and Φ sanctify this chalice through this anointing, and our Φ benediction in Christ Jesu our

Lord: who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Ghost.... Amen.

Then, laying aside the mitre, he says over the Chalices and Patens:

V. The Lord be with you.*R*. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, pour forth, we beseech thee, the power of thy benediction on our hands: that through our Hbenediction this Vessel and Paten (*these Vessels and Patens*) may be sanctified and be made by the grace of the Holy Ghost a new sepulchre for the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Through the same....in the unity of the same Holy Ghost.... **Amen.**

Lastly he sprinkles the Chalice and Paten (Chalices and Patens) with holy Water, which should be done after all blessings of any kind. Whch done, he causes the Patens and Chalices to be wiped by some Priest with bread crumbs, and well cleansed; then the wipings are thrown into the fire or the sacrarium.



Before Mass, the Priest, vested in a purple cope, or without the chasuble, proceeds to bless candles to be used throughout the year at, or near, the Epistle corner of the Altar.

hands to thine honor and to sing thy praises: and we beseech thee to have mercy on all that call upon thee, whom thou hast redeemed with the precious Blood of thy Son: Who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God: throughout all ages, world without end. **Amen.**

Here the Priest sprinkles the candles thrice with Holy Water, saying the antiphon "Thou shalt purge me, O Lord, with hyssop...", without chant or psalm. He then censes the candles three times. He then takes candles and distributes them to the clergy and to the laity, who kiss first the candle, then the priest's hand.

O Sion, adorn thy bride-chamber, and receive Christ the King: greet Mary, who is the gate of heaven: for she beareth the King of the glory of the new light: she remaineth a Virgin, yet beareth in her hands a Son begotten before the morning star: whom Simeon took into his arms, declaring to the nations that he is the Lord of life and death, and Savior of the world.

Antiphon. Luke 2:26-29. It was revealed unto Simeon by the Holy Ghost, that he should not see death, before he had seen the Lord's Christ: and when they brought the Child into the temple, then took he him up in his arms, and blessed God, and said: Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace. V. When his parents brought in the Child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the law, then took he him up in his arms.

UPON ENTERING THE CHURCH

The Liturgy continues with the Mass.

Che Blessing of Chroats on St. Blaise Day

Note that this blessing may be administered at the conclusion of the Candlemas service, or on St. Blaise's Day, February 3rd. The blessing is given with two unlit candles held crossed beneath each person's throat, blessed according to the following form.

Let us pray: Almighty and most merciful God, who hast created all things by the power of thy Word, and who, for the salvation of mankind, hast willed that the same Word, by whom all things were made should become incarnate: thou who art great and doest wondrous things, awesome and worthy of praise: for the confession of whose faith the glorious Martyr and Bishop Blaise, spurning diverse torments, was counted worthy to receive the martyr's palm: to whom, among other gifts thou didst grant the virtue of healing infirmities of the throat through thine almighty power; we humbly beseech thy majesty that, regarding not our sins, thou would be deign to # bless, through his prayers, this creature of wax, sanctifying and hallowing it through thy grace: that all who with a lively faith receive its impress upon their throats, may be free from all ailments of the same, and being restored to health, may show forth in thy holy Church their thankfulness for thy benefits, by praising thy glorious Name, which is worthy of eternal benediction, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

And let the candles be sprinkled with holy Water. The people come forward for the blessing as the priest says for each person: By the intercession of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, may almighty God keep you from all sickness of the throat and all other illness. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Che Blessing and Imposition of Ashes on Ash Alednesday

Before Mass, ashes prepared from the branches of Palm or other trees blessed on the previous Palm Sunday are blessed, as follows. The Priest, vested in a purple cope, or without the chasuble, proceeds to bless the ashes at, or near, the Epistle corner of the Altar. The choir first sings the following antiphon:

Antiphon. Ps. 69:17. Hear us, O Lord, for thy loving-kindness is comfortable: turn thee unto us, O Lord, according to the multitude of thy mercies. Ps. 69:1. Save me, O God: for the waters are come in even unto my soul. V. Glory...

V. The Lord be with you.

R. And with thy spirit.

V. Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, spare them that are penitent, be favorable to them that call upon thee; and vouchsafe to send thy holy Angel from heaven, to bleess, and sancetify these ashes, that they may be a wholesome medicine to all who humbly call upon thy holy name, who in their consciences by sin are accused, who in the sight of thy divine compassion bewail their faults, and earnestly and meekly implore thy most gracious loving-kindness: and grant to all them that call upon thy most holy name; that they, being sprinkled therewith for the redemption of their transgressions, may be preserved evermore both in body and soul. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

V. Let us pray: O God, who wouldest not the death of a sinner, but rather that he should repent: mercifully look upon the frailty of our mortal nature; and of thy goodness vouchsafe to blæess these ashes which we purpose to have set upon our heads for the increase of

humility, and the meriting of pardon; that we, acknowledging that we are but ashes, and that by reason of our vileness unto dust we shall return; may through thy mercy be found meet to receive forgiveness of all our sins, and the rewards which thou hast promised to them that are penitent. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

V. Let us pray: O God, who dost turn unto them that abase themselves, and art favorable unto them that make satisfaction: incline thy gracious ear to our prayers; and mercifully pour forth upon the heads of thy servants now to be sprinkled with these ashes the grace of thy benediction: that they being filled with the spirit of true penitence may effectually obtain those things that they have asked according to thy will. And we beseech thee to ordain that we, being stablished in these thy blessings, may cleave to the same unto life everlasting. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

V. Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, who upon the people of Nineveh, repenting in sackcloth and ashes, didst bestow the healing of thy loving- kindness: mercifully grant; that we may so imitate them in outward fashion that we may be made like unto them in the obtaining of thy pardon. Through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with thee and the Holy Ghost, liveth and reigneth, ever one God, world without end. **Amen.**

The Priest sprinkles the ashes with holy water thrice, saying "Thou shalt purge me with hyssop, O Lord, and I shall be clean, thou shalt wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow." *He then censes them thrice. The people come forward as directed for the imposition of ashes, the priest saying,* Remember, O man, that thou art dust, and unto dust thou shalt return.

ANTIPHONS DURING THE IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Joel 2:13. Immutemur. Let us change our raiment for sackcloth and ashes: let us fast and mourn before the Lord; for our God is exceeding merciful to forgive us our sins.

Joel 2:17. Let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, weep between the porch and the altar, and let them say: spare, O Lord, spare thy people: and shut not up, O Lord, the mouths of them that praise thee.

Responsory. Esther 13; Joel 2. Let us amend the sins that in our ignorance we have committed: lest the day of death come suddenly upon us, and we find no place for repentance, though we seek it. Hear, O Lord, and have mercy: for we have sinned against thee. V. *Ps.* 79:9. Help us, O God of our salvation: and for the glory of thy name deliver us, O Lord. Hear, O Lord... V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. Hear, O Lord...

After all have received ashes the priest cleanses his fingers.

V. The Lord be with you.

R. And with thy spirit.

V. Let us pray: Grant to us, O Lord, to put on the armor of our Christian warfare with prayer and fasting; that we, who are to fight against all spiritual wickedness, may be defended by the power of abstinence. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Liturgy continues with the Mass.

Che Blessing of Palms on Palm Sunday

Preparations are made at the place where the palms are to be blessed. The sacred ministers vest in purple vestments, the priest in cope. The acolytes and clergy process to the place at the appointed time as the choir sings the antiphon.

AT THE BLESSING OF THE PALMS

Antiphon. Matt. 21:9. Hosanna to the Son of David: blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. O King of Israel: Hosanna in the highest.

V. The Lord be with you.

R. And with thy spirit.

V. Let us pray. \oplus Bless, O Lord, we beseech thee, these branches of palm *(or olive, or other)*: and grant; that as thy people on this day perform this outward observance to thine honor, so they, inwardly fulfilling the same with reverence and purity of heart, may win the victory over the enemy, and continually abound in all good works. Through...

The Palms are sprinkled with Holy Water, then censed. The priest distributes the palms. The people kiss the palm and the priest's hand as they receive their palm. The choir sings the antiphons and psalms as needed.

AT THE DISTRIBUTION OF PALMS

Antiphon 1. The children of the Hebrews, bearing branches of olive, went out to meet the Lord, crying out and saying: Hosanna in the highest.

He shall subdue the people unto us * and the nations under our feet. He shall choose out an heritage for us, * even the worship of Jacob, whom he loved. *The antiphon is repeated*. God is gone up with a merry noise, * and the Lord with the sound of the trump. O sing praises, sing praises unto our God, * O sing praises, sing praises unto our God, * O sing praises, sing praises unto our God, * For God is the King of all the earth, * sing ye praises with understanding. God reigneth over the heathen, * God sitteth upon his holy seat. *The antiphon is repeated*. The princes of the people * are joined unto the people of the God of Abraham. After the prayer Cleanse my heart, the Gospel book is censed and the gospel is sung.

AT THE PROCESSION WITH BLESSED PALMS

V. Let us go forth in peace. R. In the Name of Christ. A-men.

The antiphons are sung as needed. The hymn, Gloria, laus et honor (All glory, laud and honor), is always sung.

Antiphon 1. The multitudes with flowers and palms go forth to meet the Redeemer; and render worthy homage to the triumphant conqueror: the Gentiles with their lips proclaim the Son of God: and in the praise of Christ their voices thunder through the skies: Hosanna!

Antiphon 2. With the Angels and the children may we be found faithful, crying unto the vanquisher of death: Hosanna in the highest!

Antiphon 3. A great multitude, that were come together to the feast, cried unto the Lord: Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest!

Antiphon 4. Luke 19:37-38. The whole multitude of them that went down began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice, for all the mighty works which they had seen, saying: Blessed is the King that cometh in the name of the Lord; peace on earth, and glory in the highest.

The hymn, Gloria, laus et honor, is sung (SAH #97).

Antiphon 5. All men praise thy name, and say: Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.

Ps. 147. Lauda, Jerusalem.

Praise the Lord, O Jerusalem: * praise thy God, O Sion. For he hath made fast the bars of thy gates: * and hath blessed thy children within thee. He maketh peace in thy borders: * and filleth thee with the flour of wheat. He sendeth forth his commandment upon earth: * and his word runneth very swiftly. He giveth snow like wool:* and scattereth the hoar-frost like ashes. He casteth forth his ice like morsels: * who is able to abide his frost? He sendeth out his word, and melteth them: * he bloweth with his wind, and the waters flow. He sheweth his word unto Jacob: * his statutes and ordinances unto Israel. He hath not dealt so with any nation: * neither have the heathen knowledge of his laws. Glory be... As it was... *Antiphon 5 is repeated*.

Antiphon 6. With palms bright shining we fall low before the Lord: let us all go forth to meet him with hymns and song, glorifying him and saying: Blessed be the Lord.

Antiphon 7. Hail, our King, Son of David, Redeemer of the world, whom the Prophets foretold should come to be the Savior of the house of Israel. For the Father hath sent thee into the world to be the saving victim, whom all the Saints awaited from the foundation of the world, and now: Hosanna to the Son of David. Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

The hymn, Christus vincit, or some other hymn in honor of Christ the King may be sung. On entering the church is sung:

Antiphon 8. When the Lord entered the holy city, the children of the Hebrews, foretelling the resurrection of Life, With branches of palm: Hosanna, they cried, in the highest. When the people heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, they went forth to meet him. With branches of palm: hosanna, they cried, in the highest.

After the procession the priest sings:

V. The Lord be with you. *R*. And with thy spirit.

V. Let us pray. O Lord Jesu Christ, our King and Redeemer, to whose honor we, bearing these branches, have sung our solemn praises: mercifully grant; that whithersoever these branches may be carried, there the grace of thy benediction may descend, and, all the wickedness and craft of the devil being put to nought, thy right hand may protect those whom thou hast redeemed: Who livest and reignest with God the Father, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. **Amen.**

Che Service for the Blessing of Oils in Holy Aleek

This service may be offered on Maundy Thursday Eve or at another convenient time. Preparations are made for Mass. The vestments are white. Cruets or other containers of oil are prepared in the sacristy or near the credence table. A small table is placed near the epistle side of the Altar.

INTROIT *Exod. 30,25,31*. Thou shalt make an oil of holy ointment: and thou shalt speak unto the children of Israel, saying, This shall be an holy anointing oil unto me throughout your generation. *Ps. 89*. My song shall be of the loving kindness of the Lord: with my mouth will I be shewing of thy truth from one generation to another. Thou shalt make...

The Introit and Kyrie Eleison *having been sung in the usual manner, the Celebrant solemnly intones* Glory be to God on high.

COLLECT

O Lord God. Who for the regeneration of the nations that thou hast made dost make use of the ministry of priests: grant us so faithfully to follow thy plan of salvation by the gift of thy grace, that in our days thy holy people may increase in number and advance in virtue. Though...

EPISTLE James V. 13-18

The Lesson from the Epistle of blessed James the Apostle. Brethren: Is any among you afflicted? Let him pray. Is any merry? Let him sing psalms. Is any sick among you? Let him call for the priests of the Church; and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the Name of the Lord: And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sins, they shall be forgiven him. Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

GRADUAL *Ps. 28.* The Lord is my strength and my shield: my heart hath trusted in him, and I am helped: therefore my heart danceth for joy, and in my song will I praise him. *V*. The Lord is my strength: and he is the wholesome defense of his anointed.

PREFACE

It is very meet, right, just and availing to salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty everlasting God, and to call upon thee with humble supplication, that thou mayest make these oils thy creature, effective signs of life and healing for those who are to become new creatures in the sacred Font of baptism or to receive deliverance from all infirmities of souls and body; through Christ our Lord, by whom the Angels praise thy Majesty, the Dominions adore Thee, the Powers tremble, the Heavens and the heavenly Host and the blessed Seraphim join with one glad voice in extolling thee. To their voices we pray Thee, let ours be added, while we say with humble praise:

The Mass proceeds with no changes or alteration in the Canon until the final prayer To us sinners also, which is interrupted between our offences and through Christ our Lord. The Celebrant purifies his fingers and goes to the table prepared in the sanctuary and faces the Altar with acolytes standing on either side.

Meanwhile a cantor, the choir or the people sing the first three verses of the hymn O Redemptor (St. Ambrose Hymnal, #99), while the oils are brought from the sacristy.

BLESSING OF THE OIL OF THE SICK

The vessel is brought from the sacristy to the pastor by the bearer and given to him with the words:

The Oil of the Sick.

The Celebrant continues:

Let us pray: I exorcise thee, O unclean spirit, and every assault of Satan, and every illusion in the Name of the \clubsuit Father, and of the \oiint Son, and of the \oiint Holy Ghost; that thou depart from this oil, that it may be made a spiritual unction to fortify the temple of the living God; that in it the Holy Ghost may dwell, through the Name of God the Father almighty, and through the Name of his most dearly beloved Son our Lord Jesus Christ, who shall come to judge the living and the dead, and the world by fire. **Amen.**

V. The Lord be with you.,*R*. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: Send forth we beseech thee, O Lord, thy Holy Ghost the Paraclete from heaven upon this rich olive oil, which thou has vouchsafed to bring forth out of a green tree, for the refreshment of soul and body: that by thy holy benediction whosoever is anointed with this ointment of heavenly healing, wherewith thou didst anoint Priests, Kings, Prophets, and martyrs, may receive protection of soul and body, for the deliverance from all pains, all infirmities, and all sickness of soul and body; may it be that perfect Chrism, O Lord, blessed by thee for us, abiding in our hearts: in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The celebrant washes his hands and goes with his attendants to the step of the Altar; he genuflects, ascends to the Altar, and proceeds with the Mass, until after the Communion.

THE BLESSING OF THE OIL OF THE CATECHUMENS

The Vessel of Oil for the Catechumens is brought to the pastor from the sacristy.

The assistant says:

The Oil of the Catechumens.

The celebrant breathes three times over the Oil of the Catechumens in the form of the cross, saying,

Let us pray: I exorcise thee, O creature of Oil, in the Name of God the Father \clubsuit Almighty, and in the Name of \clubsuit Jesus Christ, and of the \clubsuit Holy Ghost, that by this invocation of the undivided Trinity and by the power of the one Godhead, all the most wicked powers of the enemy, all the inveterate malice of the devil, every violent assault, and every disorderly and dark illusion may be rooted out, and chased away, and dispelled from thee: that hallowed by divine mysteries, thou mayest be for the adoption both of the flesh and the spirit of those who shall be anointed with thee, for the forgiveness of all sins: that their bodies may be sanctified for receiving all spiritual grace. Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, Who shall come to judge the living and dead, and the world by fire. **Amen.**

V. The Lord be with you.*R*. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: O God the rewarder of all spiritual growth and progress, Who by the power of the Holy Ghost dost strengthen the first beginning of feeble minds, deign, O Lord, we beseech Thee, to send down Thy blessing upon this Oil, and grant that all who approach the laver of regeneration may, though the unction of this Thy creature, be cleansed in mind and body; that if any pollution of their spiritual enemies have adhered to them, it may depart at the touch of this hallowed Oil; let there be no place for the wickedness of spirits, no occasion for the apostate angels, no power of concealment left to the snares of sin; but to Thy servants, who come to the Faith and are to be cleansed by the operation of Thy Holy Spirit, let the preparation of this unction be serviceable for that salvation, which they are to gain when born by heavenly generation in the sacrament of Baptism. Through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord, Who shall come to judge the living and the dead, and the world by fire. **Amen.**

The celebrant and other clergy salute the Oil of the Catechumens saying thrice, each time on a higher note



Hail, ho-ly Oil!

The Oils are carried by the subdeacon (or other assistant) back to the sacristy in procession while the hymn O Redemptor is continued (St. Ambrose Hymnal, #99).

COMMUNION *Mark 6.12-13*. The Apostles preached that men should repent. And they cast out many devils, and anointed with oil many that were sick, and healed them.

POSTCOMMUNION

Grant, we beseech thee, O Lord: that as we pass from the old to the new, we may cast off the old man and renew our souls in holiness. Through...

HOLY UNCTION

After the Mass, the Sacrament of Holy Unction may be administered to the people. The priest, extending his right hand over the heads of those to receive Holy Unction, says:

In the Name of the \clubsuit Father and of the \clubsuit Son, and of the \clubsuit Holy Ghost, may there be extinguished in you all power of the devil, through the imposition of our hands, and through the invocation of the glorious and holy Virgin Mary Mother of God, and of her illustrious Spouse Joseph, and of all the holy Angels, Archangels, Patriarchs, Prophets, Apostles, Martyrs, Confessors and Virgins, and of all the Saints. **Amen**.

Then dipping his thumb in the holy Oil, he anoints each person in the form of a Cross on the forehead,

Through this Holy Φ Unction may the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss. **Amen.**

Or,

I anoint thee with Oil, and lay my hands upon thee, in the Name of the \oplus Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost; beseeching the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all thy pain and sickness of body, mind, or spirit being put to flight, the blessing of health may be restored to thee.

This being completed, the Priest rubs his thumb with bread crumbs, washes his hands and wipes them with the towel. The water and bread shall in due course be cast into the sacrariun. He may add,

O Blessed Redeemer, relieve, we beseech thee, by Thy indwelling power, the distress of these thy servants; release them from sin, and drive away all pain of soul and body, that being restored to soundness of health, that may offer Thee praise and thanksgiving, Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

Let him call for the priests of the Church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with Oil in the Name of the Lord: and the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up: and if he hath committed sins, they shall be forgiven him; cure, we beseech thee, O our Redeemer, by the grace of the Holy Ghost, the weakness of the sick, heal their wounds and put away their sins; cast out from them all pain of mind and body and mercifully give back to them full health, both inwardly and outwardly, that being restored by the help of thy mercy, they may return to their duties as of old: Who with the Father and the same Holy Ghost livest and reignest God, world without end. **Amen.**

Let us pray: Look O Lord, we beseech thee, upon these thy servants and handmaidens, and comfort again the souls which thou hast created: that being amended by chastisement, they may feel themselves to be saved by thy healing. **Amen.**

Let us pray: O Lord holy, Father Almighty, everlasting God, who in pouring the grace of thy blessing upon sick bodies dost preserve by thy manifold goodness thy handiwork: graciously assist us who call upon thy Name; deliver thy servants and handmaidens from all sickness and give them health; raise them up by thy right hand; and strengthen them by thy might; protect them by thy power; and with all the prosperity which they desire restore them to thy holy Church. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then shall the people kiss the Cross presented to them by the Priest.

Che Blessing of the Paschal Fire and Paschal Candle on Holy Saturday

The service begins in darkness. Fire is struck from flint and from it coals are kindled. The ministers stand with the cross, blessed water and incense before the door, in the entry of the church, or within it. The Priest blesses the new fire, saying:

V. The Lord be with you.

R. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: O God, who through thy Son, the true cornerstone, hast bestowed upon the faithful the fire of thy brightness: sanct^{*}ify this new fire, now struck from the flint-stone, to be profitable to our service: and grant unto us that by this paschal feast we may be so inflamed with heavenly desires; that we may with pure hearts attain unto the feast of thy eternal brightness. Through the same Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

He sprinkles the fire thrice, an acolyte places blessed coals in the thurible, and the Priest puts incense into the thurible, blessing it in the usual manner. He then censes the fire thrice. The paschal candle is carried into the midst before the priest who cuts it in the following manner, saying:

Christ yesterday and today (he cuts a vertical line)

The Beginning and the End *(he cuts a transverse line, forming a cross)*

Alpha (he cuts above the vertical line the Greek letter alpha)

And Omega (he cuts beneath the vertical line the letter omega)

His are the times (he cuts the first number of the current year in the left upper angle of the cross)

And ages (he cuts the second number of the current year in the right upper angle of the cross)

To him be glory and dominion (he cuts the third number of the current year in the left lower angle of the cross)

Through all the ages of eternity. Amen. (he cuts the fourth number of the current year in the right lower angle of the cross).

Five grains of incense are then placed into the candle, the priest saying:

- (1) Through his holy and glorious
- (2) Wounds
- (3) May Christ the Lord
- (4) Guard
- (5) And preserve us. Amen.

Then the Deacon hands to the Priest a small candle, kindled with the new fire, with which he lights the paschal candle saying:

May the light of Christ gloriously rising scatter the darkness of heart and mind.

The Priest then blesses the lighted candle saying:

V. The Lord be with you.

R. And with thy spirit.

Let us pray: We beseech thee, almighty God, that the abundance of thy bless ing may come down upon this lighted candle: and as thou, thyself unseen, art the regenerator of all things, so kindle a light to lighten our darkness; that not only may our sacrifice, which is offered on this night, be illumined by the inward presence of thy light; but that in all places wheresoever the same shall be carried from this mystery here sanctified, the wickedness of the crafts of the devil may be driven forth, and the power of thy majesty ever be present. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.** Then the sacred ministers begin the procession; the deacon, carrying the paschal candle, sings three times, each time on a higher tone:



V. The light of Christ. R. Thanks be to God.

All the candles, except those at the altar are lit and the Exultet is sung.

Blessing of Meat, Eggs and Bread at Pascha

This blessing may be administered at the meal following the Paschal Vigil.

We beseech thee, O Lord, that the grace of thy \textcircled blessing may come down upon these eggs created by thee: that thy faithful people who thankfully partake of them may find them healthful food in honor of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ: who with thee and the Holy Spirit, liveth and reigneth, ever One God, world without end. **Amen.** O Lord, holy Father, almighty everlasting God, vouchsafe to \textcircled bless this bread with thy spiritual benediction: that it may be to all who partake of it, health of mind and body, a defense against all diseases and every snare of the enemy. Through thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord, the living bread, who came down from heaven and giveth life and salvation to the world; who with thee and the Holy Spirit, liveth and reigneth, ever One God, world without end. **Amen.**

And let the food be sprinkled with holy Water.

Pilgrims about to set out for holy places, according to the ancient custom of the Church, should take care to obtain letters of commendation from their Ordinary or Parish Priest. Having obtained these, and settled their affairs, and made confession of their sins, they hear Mass, in which the Prayer for those making a pilgrimage is said, as a Collect pro re gravi imperata, and they devoutly receive the Holy Eucharist. Mass being ended, the Priest says the following prayers over them kneeling:

Then he shall celebrate a Mass for them, which enjoys the same privileges as the Mass for bridegroom and bride. This may be a votive of the Holy Trinity or of the Blessed Virgin Mary, but not the votive for bridegroom and bride, the Collect for thanksgiving being added under one ending with the first. After the last Gospel the Celebrant, having laid aside the maniple, turning to the man and wife shall recite the following prayers over them:



The Te Deum is sung on occasions of special thanksgiving after Mass, or as a separate function, or during Benediction, as may be appointed. It is sung during Benediction on New Year's Eve, December 31st, or on the last Sunday evening of the year, and on the evenings of the Sunday after Corpus Christi, before the Tantum ergo.

At Benediction while the Priest intones We praise thee, O God, he himself and all others kneel: then all stand, and the Choir continues: on other occasions all stand from the beginning.

Che Order for the Hdmission of Catechumens

AT THE DOORS OF THE CHURCH

The Priest, having ascertained the name(s), questions those coming to him.

Priest: *N*. What do you ask of the Church of God? *R*. Faith. *Priest*: What does Faith bring you to? *R*. Life Everlasting.

Priest: If then you desire to enter into life, keep the commandments. Thou shalt love the Lord thy God, with all thy heart, with all thy soul, and with all thy mind; and thy neighbor as thyself.

Then he blows three times gently into the face of the person, and says once (separately to each): Go out of him (her) thou unclean spirit, and give place unto the Holy Spirit the Paraclete.

Then, with the Oil of Catechumens, he makes with his thumb the sign of the cross on the forehead and on the breast of the person, saying separately to each: Receive the Sign of the Cross both upon thy \clubsuit forehead and also on the \clubsuit heart; take unto the the faith of the heavenly teachings; and be thou such in thy manner of living, that thou mayest now be the temple of God.

Let us pray: We beseech thee, O Lord, graciously hear our prayers, and keep with thy perpetual power this thy *servant (handmaid)*, *N.*, who hath been signed with the sign of the Cross of the Lord: that *he (she)*, remaining true to the first lessons *he (she)* has learned concerning the greatness of thy glory, may by keeping of thy commandments be worthy to attain unto the glory of new life. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Then he places his hand upon the head of each person, and afterwards holding his hand extended, he says.

Let us pray: Almighty and everlasting God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, vouchsafe to look upon this thy *servant (handmaid)* N., whom thou hast been pleased to call to take *his (her)* first steps in the faith: drive far from *him (her)* all blindness of heart: break all the snares of Satan, wherewith *he (she)* hath been bound: open to *him (her)*, O Lord, the gate of thy mercy, that, being filled with the sign of thy wisdom, *he (she)* may be free from all evil desires, and in the sweet savor of thy commandments may joyfully serve thee in thy Church and prosper from day to day. 

Note concerning the conclusion of Collects

In the Mass and Divine Office the longer ending is always used, viz., Through (the same) Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord: Who liveth and reigneth with thee and the (same) Holy Ghost, ever one God (*or* God, throughout all ages), world without end.

If the Collect be addressed to God the Son, it concludes: Who livest and reignest with God the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever one God (*or* God, throughout all ages), world without end.

Outside the Mass and Divine Office, the shorter ending is used, viz., Through Christ our Lord; or (if the Collect be addressed to God the Son): Who livest and reignest, world without end (or for ever and ever).



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Short Formulas for use in Emergencies

BAPTISM

 $N_{\rm \cdot}$, I baptize thee in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

CHRISMATION

N., I sign thee with the sign \clubsuit of the Cross, and I confirm thee with the Chrism of Salvation: the Seal of the gift of the Holy Spirit. In the Name of the \clubsuit Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

ABSOLUTION

When grave necessity presses in danger of death, the Priest may say briefly:

I absolve thee from all censures and sins, in the Name of the P Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

HOLY VIATICUM

Then the Priest gives the Eucharist to the sick person by way of Viaticum with these words

Receive brother (sister) the Viaticum of the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ, and may He preserve thee from the malicious enemy and bring thee to everlasting life. **Amen.**

HOLY ANOINTING

In case of necessity, it suffices to anoint one sense only, or more fittingly the forehead, with this shorter form:

Through this holy $mathbf{H}$ Unction the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss. **Amen.**

If there be doubt whether the sick person yet lives, the Priest shall anoint conditionally saying:

If thou livest, through this holy P Unction the Lord pardon thee whatsoever thou hast done amiss. **Amen.**
